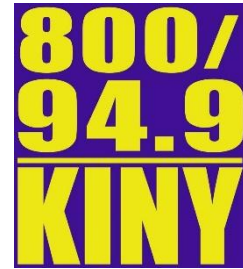

#### **Jan Edh 6.12.2025:**

21/11 blev inte alls bra. Jag startade redan tidig eftermiddag 20:e med förhoppningar om Asien. Några kineser vid 17 UTC, annars ingenting, blev det nedslående resultatet. Natten inte mycket bättre. En del starka colombianer på höga frekvenser vid 02, sedan NA med bra styrkor men svår fading och väldigt distade signaler till fram emot 04, Sedan mest bara brus som dränkte kvarvarande signaler.

22/11 av någon anledning inget inspelat.

23/11 trodde jag att solen hade lugnat sig och 317 grader skulle kunna ge något. Ännu en i en lång rad av missar. Under större delen av natten var det mest brus och sprak och en och annan svag östkust-NA, t o m ett par puertoricaner och colombianer, som visade att jag valt fel antenn. Mot morgonen faktiskt gamla trotjänaren KBRW och senare också flera från Canada, framför allt från SK/AB.

24/11 likartad öppning mot nordvästra Canada men den här natten framför allt vid 02, mycket sämre och mycket brusigare mot morgonen. Försvinnande få signaler från USA-sidan av gränsen (1000, 1130,1160, 1540).

25/11 var nära "absoluta botten": En envist pratade spansktalande kvinna utan id på 1480 vid 00. Radio Buenos Aires med nationalsång 1350 och Harbour Light 1400 03, och vid 06 WEGA 1350, möjligen Monumental 1510 och WKBK(!) 1520 07 UTC.

26/11 inget inspelat.

27/11 gick det en hel del från framför allt Argentina och Uruguay från strax före 00 till en stund efter 01 UTC på övre delen av bandet. De flesta var dock för svaga för id. Sedan var det framför allt några stationer från Brasilien som kom fram hörbart under ett par timmar. Knappt något som orkade fram mot morgonen.

28/11 var det ungefär samma stationer som natten innan, men ännu lite svagare signaler. Vid 07 hade det dock delvis svängt och de bästa (enda) signalerna var i stället peruanen Santa Rosa 1500 och ecuadorianen Monumental 1510.

29/11 hade jag gått från 255 till 285 grader. Men det hjälpte inte. En liten öppning vid 02 med Puerto Rico och Colombia men inget av större intresse. Caribbean R Lighthouse 1160 som drabbades av brand i en kondensator i sändaren 22/11 och sedan dess tydligen går oregelbundet och med reducerad effekt gick dock bitvis kanonbra denna natt.

30/11 Caribbean R Lighthouse 1160, WEGA 1350, Harbour Light 1400 var de enda stationerna som av och till överhuvudtaget gick att uppfatta under natten!

1/12 och fortsatt bedrövligt dåligt. "Toppen" kom vid 00 UTC då också PR 1070, 1210, 1280, 1480, 1490, Colombia 1250, 1580 och Venezuela 1450 kunde skymtas kortvarigt.

2/12 och ännu en "värdelös" natt. 1280 NotiUno vid 00, 1580 Uniminuto 02, NA 1520 och 1540 (WKBK och KXEL?) efter 05 kunde anas...

3/12 gick ett par till av de vanligaste puertoricanerna (870, 1120, 1160), till och med peruanen Santa Rosa 1520 om än dåligt vid 00 UTC. "Något spansktalande" på 1200 kl 01. Femte natten i följd med 285 grader inkopplat utan att något intressant kunnat höras, däremot märks det att vi närmar oss jul med allt mer störningar som kommer från "julpyntet" i Delsbo.

4/12. Om det finns grader att komparera "usel" med, var det möjligen lite bättre denna natt, trots att den oändliga raden av störningar tagit ny fart. Ett antennbyte till 255 grader gjorde kanske sitt till. Framför allt en del från Brasilien, men också en hel del La Plata-stationer, men de flesta så svagt att det hade varit lönlöst att ens försöka hitta id. Efter 03 var det dock inget kvar.

#### **Rolf Rönnberg 6.12.2025:**

Den bästa kondsdagen var 24.11, alltså dagen innan en kraftig störning, Det kryllade av MN, ND, SD-stationer och det märks att Parkaantennen fungerar bra mot detta område.

Det märks att det blir mörkare på morgnarna, stationerna hörs hela fm emellanåt. Stationerna verkar svara skapligt ännu, skickar med ett QSL från KGFX-1060, de sänder classic country.

**Ronny Forslund 6.12.2025:**

Mörker. Ja, det tycker jag är en bra sammanfattning av de senaste månadernas konds. När andra har kondstoppar som levererar mängder med Karibienstationer inklusive en bunt dominikaner så har vi i Fredriksfors bara brus. De signaler som säkert når även oss är för svaga för att tränga igenom brusmattan. Nu går vi mot jul vilken innebär att varenda j-a dellbo smäller upp blinkande juldekorationer på sina hus, allt i syfte att överglänsa grannen. Detta gör att Delsbo samhälle (som ligger i västlig riktning från Fredriksfors) är en veritabel störsändare. Men det är så verkligheten ser ut för oss och vi får glädjas åt det lilla vi ändå lyckas vaska fram. Fortfarande är DX-ing en mycket trevlig hobby.

There was an exceptional opening on 6 December, when a large number of stations from South America could be heard around midnight, with signal strengths mostly reminiscent of local stations. The focus was on Brazil, Uruguay and Argentina. Asia is mostly poor, with a small window to China around 22 UT, but overall it can only get better. My AziLoop antenna has continued to prove its worth, offering a flexibility that a short Beverage antenna cannot, of course, and still enabling almost the same signal strengths. For me, it's the best purchase if you can't set up many Beverages and still want to hear well. Today, Monday, 8 December, strong US signals could be heard again for the first time, and with the K values falling, it is even possible to receive signals from stations further west again in some cases. KXEL came in very strong today at 04 UT on 1540, so let's hope for signals from the prairie in the coming weeks.

# DX in Scotland

Every year since 2008, I've been happy to visit my friend Martin Hall GM8IEM in north-west Scotland, thanks to Martin and his wife for their welcome.

This year the weather was very windy - the windiest weather I have experienced in 17 years of visits. Martin's QTH is on the coast and strong winds are often experienced there, but this was at the upper end of the wind scale. There are Beverages in several directions. The wind caused damage to all three of the Beverages in use at the time. Two were only broken in one or two places, but one was broken in six places, with the wire blown far off the intended alignment. One of the posts that secures the antenna at intervals was hit so hard by the wind that it was loose in the ground. Also an electricity pole had been struck by lightning causing a power cut between 0620 and 1500 on Friday 28th November, so no DX-ing possible that day.

You can see a review of the weather at the time here: <https://www.weatherdiary.uk/2025/11/28/27-28-nov-2025-gales-across-the-nw-of-scotland/> - gusts of 70mph (113km/h) at the nearest weather station, Aultbea.

When the wind dropped on the Friday afternoon we went out to repair the antennae and re-secure the post (see picture). Martin advises that locally the winds exceeded 80mph (129 km/h) - his location is very exposed.

It was still cold with hail and rain but the lower wind made it feel better. I attach some photos I took, also one of me taken by Martin with a fence post knocker. It's very heavy; the Beverages are long and the ground is not easy walking. I also attach pictures I took from a high point in three directions showing the distant snow-covered mountains of the Scottish Highlands.

I hope this might give you a flavour of the location, and perhaps you have not seen a picture of me before. I was wearing four layers of clothing so it makes me look quite fat. I'm not as fat as I look in the pictures!

There were fewer logs than in previous years due to disturbed conditions. The best catch was 1020 Radio Kinsachata on 1st December at 0659 (thanks to FD for listening and confirming). Also 1250 HJOK Emisora ABC Barranquilla, signing off at 0002 on 28th November.

# American Forces Radio

## AFRS in Iceland

Updated from a 1993 original on November 21st, 2025.

The Danish–Icelandic Act of Union agreement<sup>i</sup>, signed by Iceland and Denmark on Dec. 1st, 1918, recognized Iceland as a fully independent and sovereign state known as the Kingdom of Iceland, associated with Denmark in a personal union with the Danish King.

After the occupation of Denmark by Nazi Germany on April, 9th 1940, communications between Iceland and Denmark severed, and the day after, *The Alþingi* (Parliament of Iceland) took control of foreign affairs and the Coast Guard. A provisional governor was elected, and Iceland became in reality fully sovereign from Denmark.

As the German attack on Norway on the same date left Iceland highly exposed, Britain decided it could not risk a German takeover of Iceland, and on May 10<sup>th</sup>, 1940, British military forces began an invasion of Iceland, their occupation developing into a Commonwealth operation with Canadian support totaling 25.000 personell.

As the British troops were needed elsewhere, on July 1<sup>st</sup>, 1941, the President of the United States took responsibility for Iceland's defence, and under a U.S.-Icelandic agreement the following week a provision was included that the U.S. would recognize Iceland's absolute independence<sup>iii</sup>. The British were replaced by up to 40.000 Americans, with the first U.S. troops arriving in August and September.

*Iceland Base Command*<sup>iv</sup> was active from June 16th, 1942, and it was found that the vicinity of Keflavik would be favorable for the construction of two airfields. AAC Ferrying Command (later: ATC/Air Transport Command) needed a long-range transport facility. Consequently, construction of *Meeks Field*<sup>v</sup> (named in honor of a US pilot) started on July 2nd, 1942 with the first landing at the end of March 1943 with 4 runways completed by the end of July.

*Patterson Field*<sup>vi</sup> (also named in honor of a US pilot) was already operative in summer 1942 and with Meeks also operational it became a fighter airfield for the air defense of Iceland. The two bases were also strategic aids in the Battle of the Atlantic. Patterson Field was closed after the war, but Meeks Field and the adjoining structures were eventually returned to Iceland's control.

On Dec. 31st 1943, the Act of Union expired after 25 years. In a referendum May 1944 Icelanders voted whether to establish a republic. The personal union with the King of Denmark was ended with 97% and 95% in favour of a new republican constitution. So, on June 17th, 1944, Iceland became independent, with the provisional governor *Sveinn Björnsson* as its first president. Danish King Christian X sent a message of congratulations to the Icelandic people.

*Naval Air Station Keflavik (NASKEF)*. All U.S. air activity ended on March 11th, 1947. But the U.S. military returned under a U.S.-Iceland defense agreement signed on May 5th, 1951. On May 25th, 1951 the USAF reestablished its presence at Keflavik Airport with the stationing of the 1400th Air Base Group. Jurisdiction of the airport was assumed by Military Air Transport Service (MATS<sup>vii</sup>) which re-established a military air terminal and refueling point for trans-Atlantic air service between the United States and Europe. The USN assumed the responsibility of running the air station from MATS in 1961, hence the AFRS radio station there later being called *The Navy Broadcasting Service* (see below). But joint US airforce operations that included transport and air defense were still stationed at Keflavik until the withdrawal of U.S. military from Iceland in 2006.

On March 15th, 2006 the U.S. Ambassador to Iceland announced that the United States had decided to substantially reduce the size of the Iceland Defense Force. A transition period followed and on Sept 8th, 2006, NASKEF's last commanding officer, Capt. Mark S. Laughton, presided over a ceremony effecting the disestablishment of the station which was then handed over to the Icelandic government. Since May 2008 Keflavik has periodically hosted NATO fighters, AWACS and support aircraft participating in Icelandic Air Policing deployments.

*Langanes Air Station (H-2)* in North East Iceland was established as a NATO radar station in 1951, shortly after the return of U.S. military forces to Iceland. The site was located on the peninsula of the same name and operated by the 667th Aircraft Control and Warning Sqdn, and was equipped with long-range radar systems. In January 1961, the H-2 search radar bubble blew down during a storm. The site was closed as a radar base and the 667th AC&W Sqdn was moved to Höfn Air Station (H-3), where it replaced the 933rd Aircraft Control and Warning Sqdn. The site was later used for several additional years as a communications site and for submarine detection. It had its own AFRS station and was deactivated 1968.

*Höfn Air Station (H-3)<sup>ix</sup>* on the *Stokksnes* peninsula near the eastern town *Höfn í Hornafirði* was also established as a NATO radar station under Military Air Transport Service. The 933rd Aircraft Control and Warning Squadron was activated at the facility on July 1st, 1951. The 667th AC&W Sqdn was moved from Langanes Air Station (H-2) in the 1961. Also, the U.S. Marine Corps and the USN played a role at the facility. It also had its own AFRS station and seems to have been deactivated in 1998.

*Latrar Air Station(H-4)* was built in 1953-1956, in the former village of Látrar on the sparsely inhabited *Hornstrandir* peninsula. The station was closed in 1960 and left to the elements. The site was operated by the 934th Aircraft Control and Warning (later Air Defense, Air Control) Sqdn, This station also had its own AFRS station<sup>xi</sup>.

### **AFRS stations in Iceland.**

AFRS started broadcasting in Iceland in 1943 with SIGI Meeks Field. Over the years, it seems five+ AFRS stations have been operating in the country. As with all AFN stations that went on the air, the AFRS program package from Los Angeles was the basic programming for the Iceland stations supplemented by local announcements and djing.

**1380 kHz** SIGI Camp Meeks, Keflavik 300 watts.(1945.) The station started already July 1943<sup>xii</sup>. No dx logs are known, but some small pieces of information about SIGI(Station Iceland, GI??) has been found:

*In March 1945, the station has now "entered the big time" and "has...call letters(SIGI) assigned". SIGI has got back the voice of Cpl. Ken Landry, with a "soft, slow New Orleans drawl". And by June, 1945 SIGI has a "smooth, professional-sounding voice" formerly on Mutual's DC outlet WOL, WBAL Baltimore and other stations. His name Cpl. Larry Geraghty<sup>xiii</sup>.*

*On Oct.22<sup>nd</sup>, 1945 "AFRS Playback" wrote a piece on "Iceland hit parade" saying: "A recent survey of SIGI's all request program, "You asked for it"...reveals the Top Ten tunes on the rock are not listed on the current hit parade back home." Top 3 are "There I said it again"(Vaughn Monroe), "You belong to my heart"(Bing Crosby) and "Don't let your sweet love die"(Denver Darling and his Texas Cowhands). Other songs chosen by the GIs in Iceland: "Laura"(Woody Herman), "Hang your head in shame"( Bob Wills and His Texas Playboys), "Close as pages in the books"(Jane Harvey with Benny Goodman and his orchestra), "How high am I"(Louis Jordan) and "One o'clock jump"(Benny Goodman and Count Basie versions).*

*Old Bing led the list of performing artists in the SIGI Survey, his other song was Always.*  
The other most popular artists were Johnny Mercer, and Roy Acuff.

**1400 kHz? AFRS Latrar** 10 watts? 1957-1960. No logs are known.

*A great morale booster, our own Base radio Station was...born in September 1957.*

**1400 kHz AFRS Langanes** 10 watts(WRTH 1965, -1966?). "LAFS Radio"(Langanes Air Force Station Radio). No logs are known.

*The site had its own radio station operating on 10 watts of power. It was manned by volunteers and often music and news broadcasts from Keflavik were relayed to site personnel as well major league baseball games. In addition, program transcriptions from AFRS in Europe were received and played. A couple of times each day, an H-2 disc jockey would play music over the air from a stock of records collected from site personnel. Two local nightly news programs were also aired. Several of the men volunteered to man the station as disk jockeys – they kept life interesting at the site. While I was there, Lt Frem Nielsen was the OIC – he did a good job<sup>xiv</sup>.*

**1400 AFRS Langanes in 1965.** "A radio station broadcasting with 10 watts, 1400 KCs on a 24-hour basis had been another feature of the "Misty Mountain" Site. Recently however, they became part of a network originating from the Armed Forces Radio Station, Keflavik." ("The White Falcon".<sup>xv</sup>)

**1400 kHz AFRS Höfn** 10 watts(Power less than a lightbulb!). "Radio Höfn" also // 1484/1485 kHz Keflavik. Listed in WRTH from 1966-.

**Sgt. Joseph Pyrdek** takes over with his story from 1967-1968:

*H-3 also had a local outlet for Armed Forces Radio and Television Service, but we actually did not have any television!...What we did have was a radio station. It operated on 1400 kHz with power of 10 watts. When I took it over, because of a poor antenna system, it had trouble even reaching the Transient barracks, maybe five hundred yards away. The station was located across from the search radar tower, in the same building as supply and the Electronics office...After I used my Ham radio experience to properly match the antenna to the transmitter, using some coaxial cable "donated" from radar maintenance, the coverage was improved enough that we put a decent signal into the town of Hofn.*

*... some three star general, ...asked if we received any complaints from the town since back at Keflavik there was a considerable opposition raised to the AFRTS TV signal "Kef" was broadcasting. The C.O. told the three star "No. We don't even get into town." Yet I know that by that time we had several listeners in Hofn who passed on their thanks for having another radio station to listen to...*

Höfn colleague *Barney*:

*This radio station didn't work when we arrived there and I well remember you scrounging parts and cable from the radars and got it going really good. The station had lots of records and programs which helped break the boredom and isolation of H-3<sup>xvi</sup>.*

### Dxing AFRS Höfn:

SW/Stefan Wikander was first to log this station on Dec.1st, 1978 according to our sources. It was heard by this writer just after we arrived in Bud, on January 5th, 1980. It also had short appearances in the 1980-1985 seasons, but the Höfn station was never heard again on 1400 in the rest of my years in Bud<sup>xvii</sup>.

Distance from Höfn to Bud: 1099 kms.

This frequency could be quite challenging with frequent TA dx stations from Canada(CBG, CJFP, CHOA), USA(WOND, WALE, WABY, WPHD, WBTB, WLTN, WPCE, KEDO, KART, KIGO), Puerto Rico(WVOZ), Brazil(Radio Rio De Janeiro), Uruguay(R Zorilla de San Martin), Colombia(R Universal), Venezuela(R 1400 Barinas), from Ireland(Kildare Community Radio) and Norway(NRK Karasjok until 1978). And, evidently Soviet Union fishing vessels were using the channel for inter-ship creating a cozy dx atmosphere, hi!

So Höfn was no easy dx! A "rule" for its appearances at the Rectory was that if Icelandic domestic LPRTs appeared, such as 1412 kHz RÚV Húsavík+synchros and 1510 kHz RÚV Dalvík+ synchros(20 watts each), 1400 would be heard as well. I was stunned to be able to monitor 1400 quite strongly with almost no North American stations, indicating the signal path was blocked somewhere "after Iceland"! But mostly, for me 1400 was an indicator station for NA if the AFRS station suddenly appeared with some strength after periods of bad conds. Then I would know that we would soon have a fine NA opening.

**1400 kHz** 05.01.80 0830 AFRS Höfn. "This is AFRTS, 14-85 Keflavík." Also Florida and Quebec stations.

**1400 kHz** 11.01.80 0830 AFRS Höfn with Newfoundland and Nova Scotia stations.

**1400 kHz** 25.01.80 1115, 1500 AFRS Höfn. Both at sunrise and sunset.

**1400 kHz** 13.10.80 1545 AFRS Höfn. QSA 2-3. //1485, QSA 2-4. DX from all of the NA continent. In this season also JA/Jan Alvestad and OJS/Odd Jørgen Sagdahl heard the station.

**1400 kHz** 30.10.81 0845 AFRS Höfn. //1485, Quebec stations.

**1400 kHz** 04.11.81 0830 AFRS Höfn. Many regular EC NA stations.

**1400 kHz** 09.11.82 0845 AFRS Höfn. Ontario, Manitoba, Minnesota, Oklahoma stations.

**1400 kHz** 30.11.82 0800 Navy BS ID Höfn, good //1485. 1510 also strong, as was 1100 Ammassalik, Greenland.

**1400 kHz** 20.10.83 0910 AFRS Höfn //1485. Charlie Tuna.

**1400 kHz** 10.01.84 1404 AFRS Höfn //1485.

**1400 kHz** 16.04.85 0635 AFRS Höfn alone. SR at 0400. No other dx noted.

**1400 kHz** 22.04.85 1900 AFRS Höfn. Local SS. Seems to relay 1485 all the time. At 2000 1485, but no other dx.

**1400 kHz** 03.09.85 0500 AFRS Höfn. In this season also TW/Torgeir Woxen and HAH/Harry Høberg heard this tiny voice from Iceland.

**1400 kHz** 29.10.85 0945 AFRS Höfn//1485.

**1400 kHz** 08.01.1986 1000 AFRS Höfn w CBG.

**1400 kHz** 11.02.1986 0700 AFRS Höfn//1485. Mr.Mister mx, Station ID. "AM 14-85 Keflavík, Iceland".

Into AP and UPI news. Reagan-Gorbatshev summit plans, Tornadoes in Waycross, Ware county, GA etc. "AFRTS Weather" followed by wx rpt.

1484 kHz? May 1<sup>st</sup>. 1952. Permission from the Icelandic government/PTT to operate a radio station 24/7 with 250 watts.

**1484/1485 kHz** was often a challenging frequency, but there was a lot to listen to in Western Norway. The BBC eventually put transmitters for both Radio 4, 1 and 2 on 1484. BBC Radio 2 was particularly strong with its synchronized Scotland network with four transmitters, and in addition from 1972 the BBC gradually built a number of local radio stations on the frequency. From Sept.1st of that year, BBC Radio Humberside often dominated, with occasional guest appearances by BBC Radio Merseyside. When the shift to 1485 occurred on Nov.23<sup>rd</sup>, 1978 the channel opened up with more BBC stations being audible. Otherwise, stations from Norway(1484) including Svalbard(1485), Denmark, Belgium, France, West Berlin and Riga, then USSR stopped by, and on rare occasions there was American shows from AFRS here. Besides of Keflavik, the AFRS stations at Kenitra, Morocco and Kato Souli, Greece were possibilities.

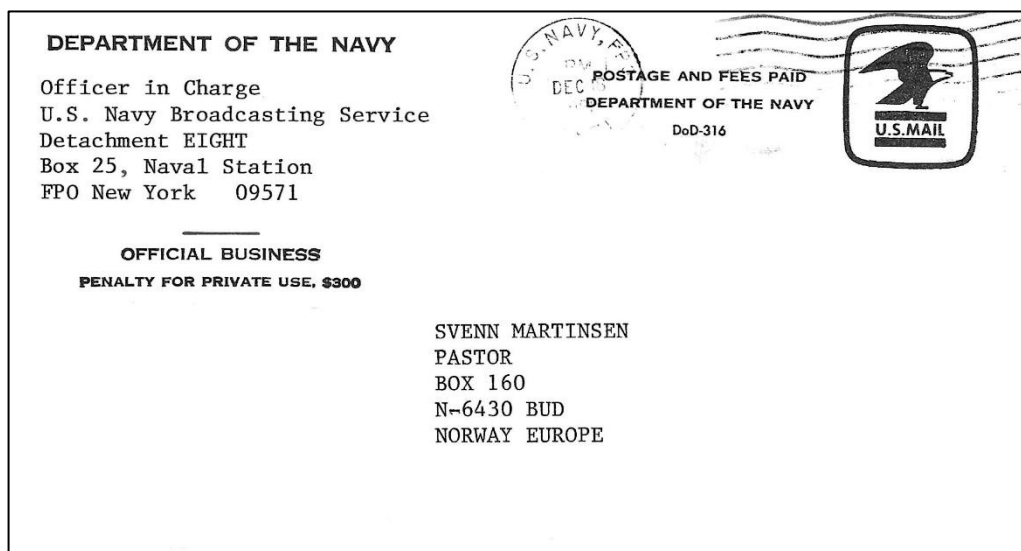

## Armed Forces Radio-Television and White Falcon Keeps NATO Base Personnel Informed

In 1941 the second great war was about to engulf America and GIs were being sent to places unheard of by most of them.

One such group found itself on a cold, barren island off the coast of Alaska.

Kodiak was the name of the island and the small group of Army personnel there found boredom one of their toughest enemies. Cut-off from the rest of the world and living under primitive field conditions, entertainment for the men was mainly what could be produced from within their own resources.

A few men got the idea of starting a radio station. Operating it would not only help fill their leisure time, but music from home, even if on records, would be welcomed by their buddies. Thus was born the Armed Forces Radio Service, later to grow from that humble beginning to encompass television and become the world wide organization it is today.

The first television station for armed forces personnel was established at Limestone AFB, Maine.

When television became of age and was brought into augment radio, a name change became necessary. In 1962, Armed Forces Radio and Television Service (AFRTS) was organized. Supervised by the Department of Defense directorate of Information and Education, the worldwide AFRTS organization is under the operational control of its parent headquarters in Los Angeles.

The mission of AFRTS, as defined by a Defense Department directive, is to provide U. S. armed forces personnel outside the continental United States, in certain

isolated areas, and in specified military and veterans hospitals where U. S. commercial radio and television programs are not available or adequate, with programs of information, education, and entertainment, which would otherwise not be available to them.

While the mission of AFRTS includes information, education and entertainment, the emphasis is on information. AFRTS' selection of both radio and television programming is geared toward informing the overseas American serviceman who is isolated from printed media.

AFRTS Keflavik is one of many radio and television outlets located wherever U. S. armed forces personnel are stationed. The local radio station broadcasts 24 hours per day seven days per week. Television begins operation at 4 p. m. on weekdays, 10:30 a.m. Saturday and at 2 p.m. Sundays. Sign-off is at the end of the late show, usually between midnight and 1 a.m.

Control of the local AFRTS is vested in the U. S. Naval Station public affairs officer who serves as a special assistant on the staff of Capt. Emile E. Pierre, naval station commander. The station newspaper, a four to six page weekly, published on Friday, is the responsibility also of the public affairs officer.

Currently assigned to the three operations — radio, television, and newspaper — are 17 Navy personnel, five Air Force, and one Marine.

### 1484 ON YOUR RADIO

Programming materials used on radio and television are limited to those procured and cleared by the Los Angeles AFRTS headquarters. Local station personnel have no prerogatives in obtaining additional programming of a special type to satisfy particular requests.

The accompanying articles and photographs are intended to inform listeners and readers of the operations of three segments of the public affairs office. Groups of persons interested in a first hand look may arrange a tour of the AFRTS facilities in Bldg. T-44 by calling 4168.

AFRTS Keflavik tries to schedule 51 hours of weekly programmed shows for your viewing pleasure. Seventy-two hours of television entertainment a week is planned, including special shows, news casts, and sports specials. Presently, there are eight navy personnel assigned to the AFTS Keflavik.

The Armed Forces Radio Station (AFRTS) Keflavik broadcasts 24

hours daily. It offers a variety of entertainment, information and education.

The AFRS record library is composed of 10,000 popular records and 7,500 records combining semi-popular, Latin, religious, and children's selections. There are 42 programmed hours weekly that bring you stateside programs. Live radio shows include sport features, presidential press conferences, space projects, and our own local DJ shows.

The station presently has four disk jockeys who work around the clock to provide you the latest news and events, besides operating the different programs.

The AFRTS newsroom operates in conjunction with the radio and television sections.

The method of disseminating news is a series of 5 and 15

minutes and half hour news roundups on evenings for television. The newsroom has three main sources from which to compile news reports.

The United Press International Radio-Teletype service has a contract with AFRTS Keflavik. The Newsroom uses UPI transmissions when reception conditions permit, but often because of weather con-



ditions, reception is poor and as a result, news must be reused.

The newsroom is equipped to receive short-wave transmissions from the AFRTS News Bureau in Washington, D. C. Aside from news, the bureau broadcasts many AFRTS programs, including the sports games, and other special features that come to you live over radio. But like the UPI circuit, reception is often garbled or the voices are weak and fading, thus we have to cancel the program or leave it live and hope reception picks up.

The third source of news material is the AFRTS Teletype operating from AFRTS Los Angeles. The circuit is connected to the Naval Communications Station Keflavik, and relayed to the station's newsroom. Messages are received daily but the copy is sometimes garbled preventing receipt of the latest news.

### CHANNEL 8

Bringing you the best in stateside programming, this is Channel Eight, your Armed Forces Television Service, telecasting from Keflavik International Airport, Iceland."

Many times an evening, these words are heard over channel eight, but few people know the workings of an armed forces television station.

AFRTS Keflavik is one station among five on the North Atlantic Film Circuit. The distribution of shows for Keflavik is done by the AFTS Los Angeles. Over 90 percent of the shows are on 16 mm motion picture film. Each week, the station receives a film shipment from Los Angeles. The films and shows have commercials removed. As a result, the programs are not a full half hour as in the states. To make up for the lost time, the station has to show fillers or short films. The fillers and short films come from a limited supply of films provided through AFRTS Los Angeles.

"Why do you show so many old programs and feature films?" This question is asked often and heard of from viewers. AFRTS purchases programs from different film distributors such as Four Star Productions and Col-

umbia Studios. If distributors can't sell the films to theaters they turn and sell them to film buyers, including AFRTS. AFRTS purchases the films and use them for their worldwide circuit. Feature films and special shows are purchased by AFRTS from leading television networks.

### THE WHITE FALCON

The WHITE FALCON is published to provide information to station personnel about local news events.

The paper is published in Reykjavik at Isafoldarprentsmidja (Isafoldar print smith) from non-appropriated funds. The WHITE FALCON is published once a week and has a circulation of 2000 readers. The deadline for news is Mondays at 3 p.m. On Wednesdays, two members of the WHITE FALCON staff go to the printers to lay out the page copies and proof read the copy plates. On Friday mornings, the paper goes to print and a WHITE FALCON staff member picks up the finished copies and distributes them early the same evening.

Because of the shortage of personnel and allowance for only a four to six page paper, we are limited from a more comprehensive day to day coverage of local events and sport happenings.

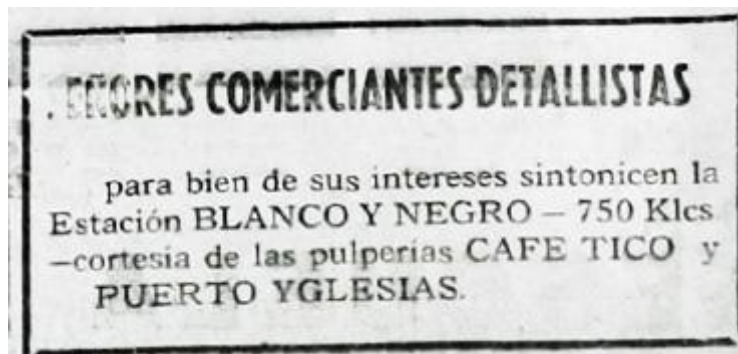
# History of Radio in Costa Rica (78): Emisora Blanco y Negro

TIRC Emisora Blanco y Negro was a station operated by Rubén Castro, transmitting on 750 kHz. The station was first mentioned in a political campaign on May 1, 1945. Their official inauguration was June 2, 1945.

Sale of a commercial radio station was announced in a classified ad section in 1949. Their contact phone number was 1847, which was formerly used by TIRC.



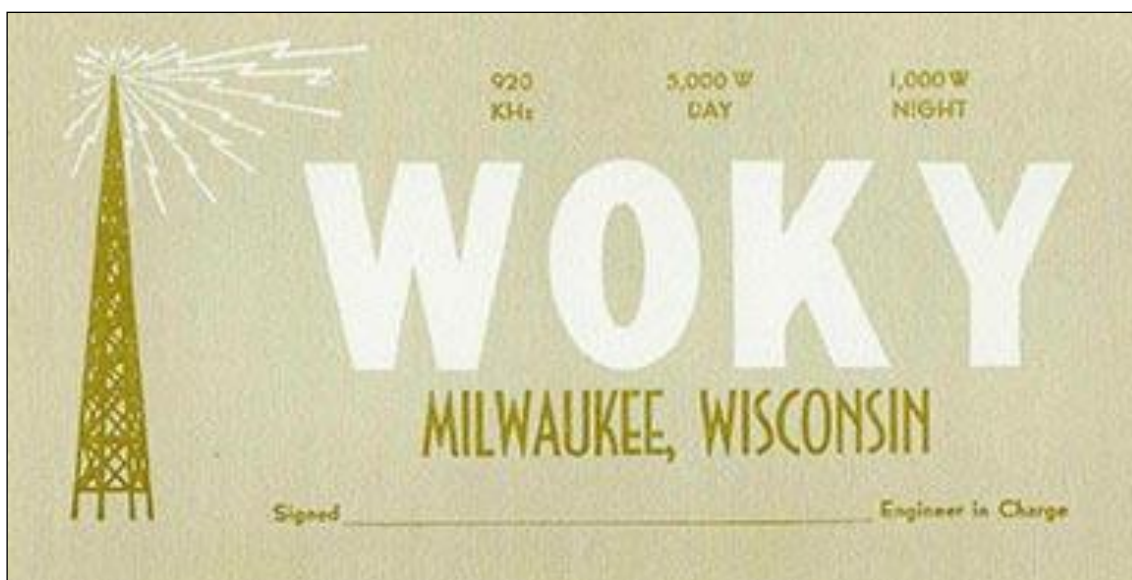

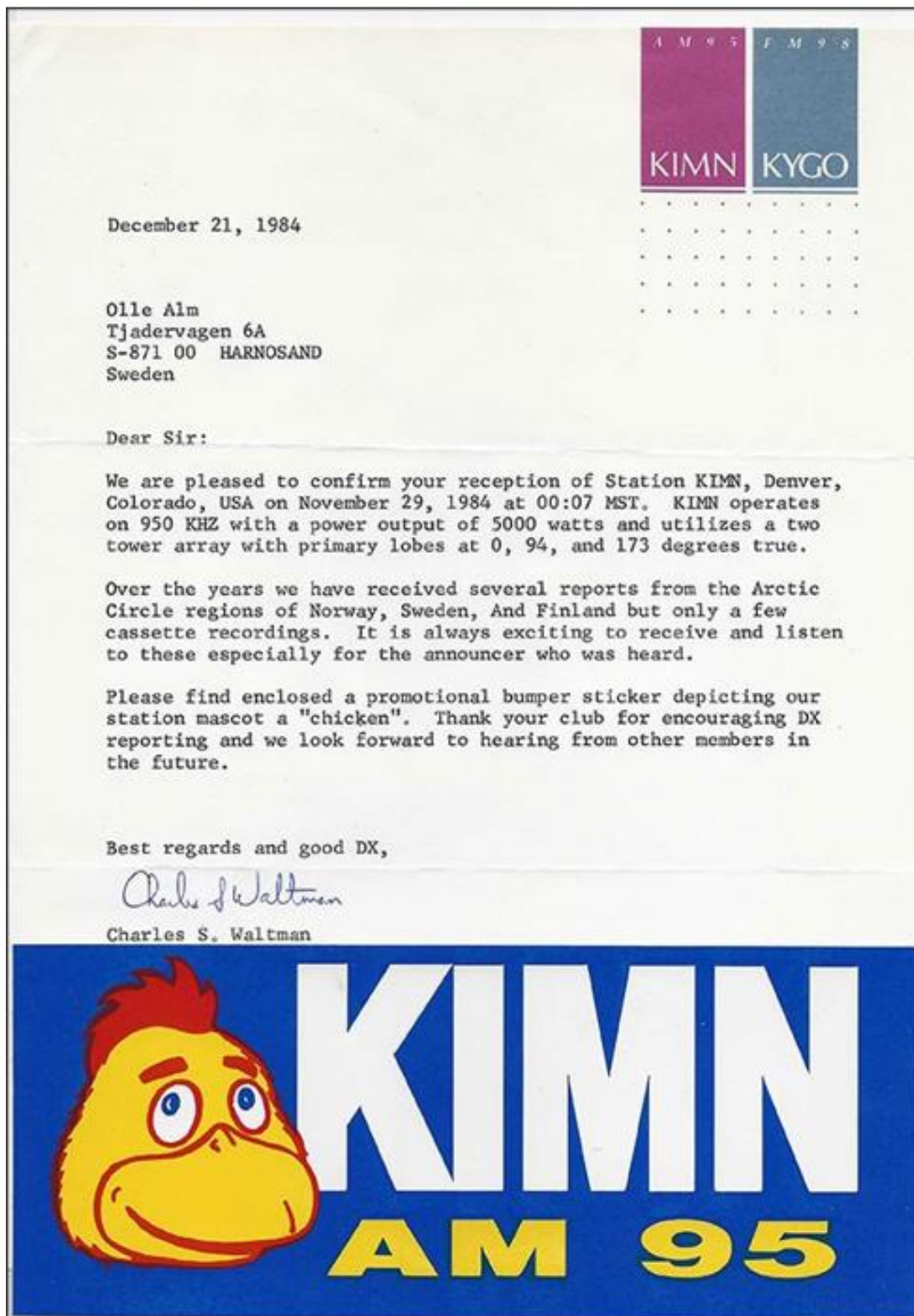

Han blev berömd för en massa galna upptåg som att hoppa med hoppstav från Denver till Boulder; han tillbringade två veckor i en ormgrop och en gång spelade han samma låt i 18 timmar för att få lyssnarna till programmet "Coca-Cola Hi-Fi Club" att reagera. Vad sponsorn och lyssnarna tyckte förtäljer inte historien.... Värt att nämna är också att KIMN sponsrade en konsert med Beatles på Red Rocks i Morrison, CO 1964. Efter ett antal formatbyten stängde stationen 1988.



Man kan knappast påstå att japsen har stått som spön i backen denna säsong. Hittills. Men vi hoppas på bättre tider och visar ett QSL som Bengt Dalhammar BD fick från JOOR i Osaka 1961.



Nedan ser vi radiohuset hos Radio Demerara i Guyana samt förmodligen en programpresentatör som cyklar hem efter jobbet. Jan Edh JE fick detta QSL för en rapport på 760 kHz år 1964. Stationen var i många år mycket vanlig på denna frekvens men är nu historia.



Den franskspråkiga stationen Radio Suisse Romande i Lausanne hördes ofta bra på 765 kHz över en sändare i Sottens, Schweiz. Här mitt eget QSL-brev. V/s Christina Cortes bifogade även dekaler och annat.

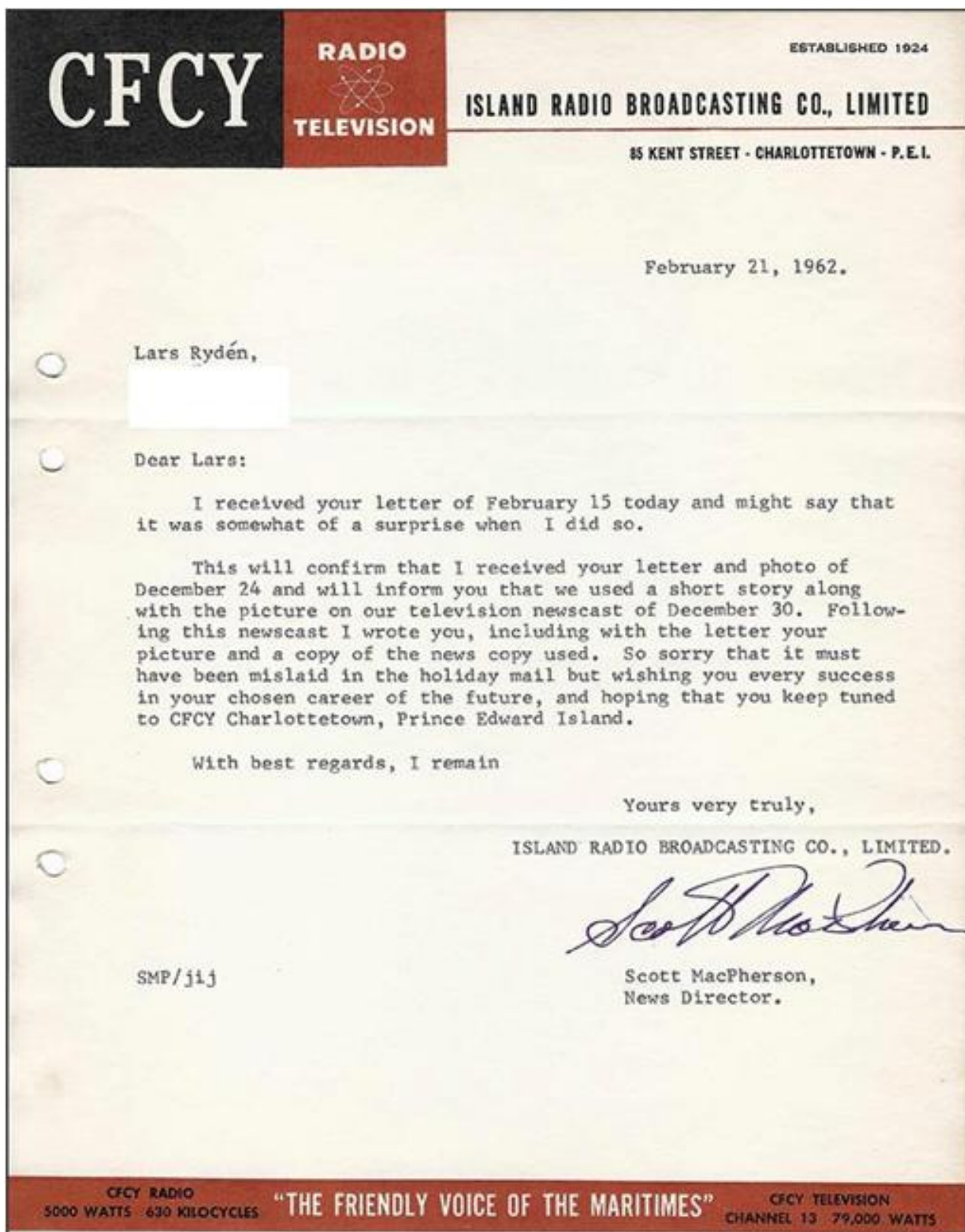

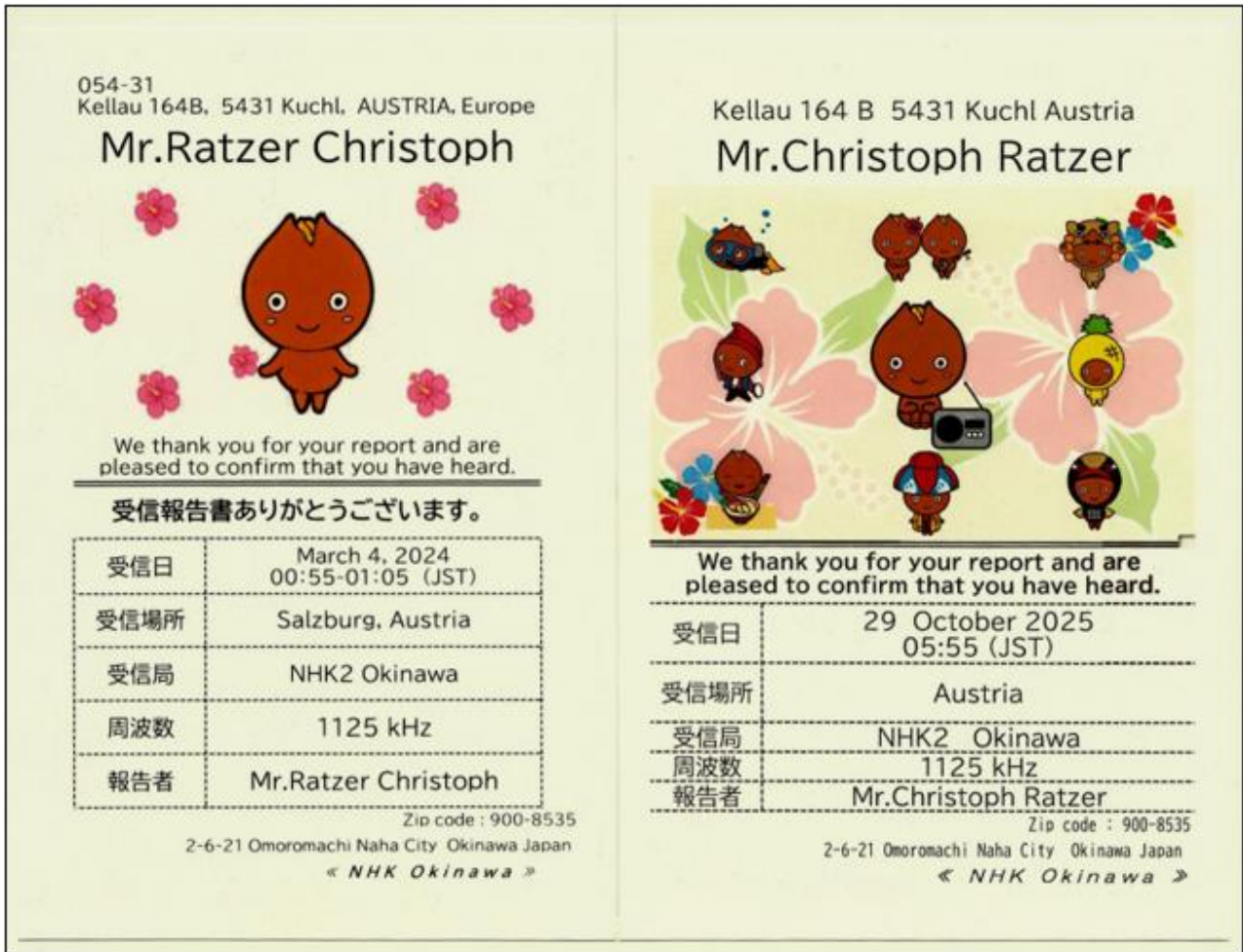

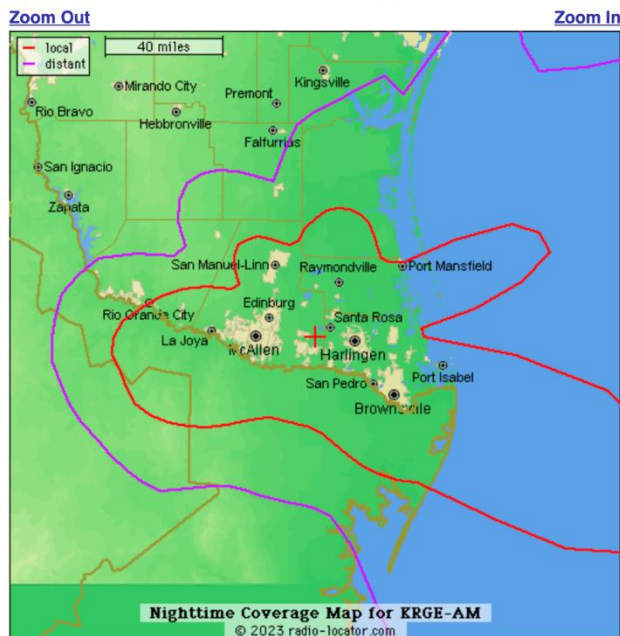

Agradecemos la información y aprovechamos para informarles algunos detalles de nuestra historia, cuando vamos hacia los 99 años de trayectoria. Somos de las radios más antiguas del país y nos congratula recibir estos reportes.

### HISTORIA

Al promediar el año 1921 los únicos medios de comunicación oral que conocía Montevideo, y podía escuchar en el curioso aparato que ya comenzaba a importar General Electric y otros adelantados comerciantes; era la estación radiotelegráfica CWA, ubicada en el Cerro de Montevideo, o algunos mensajes telegráficos de algún navío en el Puerto de Montevideo o en aguas próximas.

El espíritu emprendedor de comerciantes, hombres de negocios e investigadores creativos comenzaron a buscar todas las herramientas y conocimientos en relación a lograr instalar en nuestra capital estaciones de radios. Experimentando una y otra vez comenzó lentamente a abrirse camino la radiodifusión en nuestro país.

Así como surgieron experimentos en la capital también pasó en el interior. Unas de las primeras transmisiones de «ensayo» tuvieron lugar precisamente en Durazno con el entusiasmo de la iniciativa prendido en el corazón, de un talentoso artista, integrante de una familia circense, que soñaba con instalar una estación de radio en el corazón del país, para servir de enlace entre la ciudad y el campo tan aislado de los servicios urbanos.

Aquel joven soñador tuvo la idea, la iniciativa y la suerte que se unieran a su proyecto otras personas que integraban fuertes familias de comerciantes del país que también, desde su lugar soñaban con la radiodifusión. Así surge en 1926 después de muchos ensayos en años previos, la primera radio del interior CW 25 Radio Durazno, ocupando su lugar en los 1430 del dial. La firma constituida por Raúl Evangelisti, Luis Artola y Cía. (Dr. Emilio Frugoni y don Joaquín Serratos).

La radio comenzó a emitir una breve programación que tenía como principal misión la información, en pocas horas diarias. A medida que se investigaba y encontraban soluciones para mejorar la emisión fue afianzándose en el medio y cobrando cada vez más protagonismo, más solvencia en su nivel técnico y la programación fue enriqueciéndose. Y paso a paso, día a día fue ganando el aire de la región aquella tímida onda de música y voz que transmitía el palpitar de un pueblo, que la identificó con su nombre y se la guardó para siempre en sus haberes cotidianos, pasando a integrar un lugar de referencia en cada casa, era la voz que comunicaba lo bueno y lo malo que pasaba en el pueblo, los nacimientos, los casamientos, los fallecimientos, los compromisos sociales, las indicaciones de trabajo o el movimiento de ganado de un potrero a otro, que recibían los trabajadores del campo por parte de sus patrones, que dio a los productores durante más de 50 años una herramienta única que les ahorra tiempo, dinero, y les permitía estar en contacto con sus establecimientos. Toda la vida del departamento pasaba por las ondas de Radio Durazno.

Los primeros cuarenta años dirigida por su creador, su ideólogo un apasionado de la comunicación Don Raúl H. Evangelisti.

En 1966 la razón social de la Radio pasa a ser RADIO DURAZNO S.A. La esposa de aquel Sr. Serratoso uno de los pioneros que acompañó a don Raúl; Doña Sofia Stajano de Serratoso y su sobrino don Julio César Stajano Wilson pasan a ser los nuevos directores de la vieja y querida CW25.

Don Raúl se acoge a los beneficios jubilatorios, pero no abandona su condición de comunicador y artista y por allí continúa su obra.

La nueva radio incorpora nuevos equipos, nuevas modalidades de trabajo, prolonga los horarios de transmisión, entre las nuevas incorporaciones crea una estructura gerencial poniendo al frente de la misma a una mujer joven del medio Carmelita Bonfrisco (Carmita), profesora de expresión e idiomas, docente en escuelas, liceos. Integrante del «teatro del liceo», un verdadero taller cultural. Con ella se puso énfasis en la influencia de la radio en la educación del pueblo, la formación de jóvenes, el comportamiento social de la comunidad, el desarrollo de la solidaridad. Las iniciativas a partir del medio de comunicación para el logro de la realización de proyectos, en el campo de la salud, de la enseñanza, de las fuentes laborales. Proyectos que se lograron y siguieron creciendo en el tiempo ya despegados del empuje inicial.

Y en el año 1995 RADIO DURAZNO es adquirida por un grupo de gente joven, integrantes de la Familia Rielli San Martín, los cuales le dieron a la radio un giro de 180 grados en lo que se refiere a instalaciones y tecnología.

En los primeros días de marzo de 2002 Radio Durazno fue la primera emisora del Interior en transmitir en Internet las 24 hs.

Socialmente hablando la radio sigue tan cerca de la gente como desde el primer día, todos quienes tienen necesidades de comunicar su historia, saben que cuentan con los micrófonos de AM 1430 sin ningún tipo de pedido a cambio. Hoy en día es la emisora más escuchada de la región, según mediciones de las encuestadoras más importantes del país, la radio cubre un sin fin de localidades y Departamentos de la región centro sur de Uruguay.

Muchas gracias por los comentarios, apreciamos mucho su informe y le auguramos nuevas escuchas que agradecemos nos lo informe.
