Med på minnesstunden av dx-are var jag Kjell Eriksson - KEL och Lars Bergström - LBM. Minnesstunden var ett fint minne av Bosse med tal, några fina dikter samt minnen ur Bosses liv. Fin musik spelades bl.a. av Ted Gärdestad, Thomas Stenströmer och Louis Armstrong. Så sorgligt att ha mist en mycket god vän och så vänlig samt otroligt kunnig inom dx-hobby. Både lyssningsmässigt, tekniskt kunnig samt statistik och skrivande men i fint minne bevarat.

Jan Edh 14.3.2026:

25/2 var det mycket bra styrkor framför allt från La Plata och Brasilien. Hade det inte varit för allt splatter hade det varit "fulländat". Efter 03 blev det dock allt färre La Plata-stationer. Brasilien "höll stilen" morgonen ut, men från 05 var det också en hel del från Colombia och Västindien.

26/2 fortsatt mycket roliga konditioner från sydligaste Sydamerika. Men kanske inte riktigt lika vassa som natten innan. Kraftig försämring av signalstyrkorna efter 03 och inte särskilt bra på höga frekvenser. Uniminuto 1580 vid 06 nattens enda "nordliga" signal.

27/2 började lovande med bra styror mot framför allt Paraguay tidigt. Som helhet blev det dock lite mattare än nätterna innan. Svagare signaler och mer störningar. Mot morgonen ännu några Argentina och Brasilien på lägre frekvenser, enstaka Colombia och Puerto Rico på höga frekvenser.

28/2 och allt var helt annorlunda, eller kanske tillbaka till vad som gällt under en lång tid tidigare. Väldigt mycket sprak, enormt splatter, distat ljud på flertalet stationer – på det stora hela hopplöst att höra något. Många av stationerna från senaste dagarna fanns där nu också, tillsammans med en del Peru, Colombia och Puerto Rico, men nästan inget var tydligt.

1 – 4/3 hade jag missat inspelningen.

5/3 var jag åter igång med inspelning på den ojordade 255-gradaren men ganska klen resultat. Vid 01 några La Plata och brassar på lägre frekvenser och där AM750 gick "märkligt bra" för att plötsligt försvinna utan annonsering. Fulla 100 kW till låg natteffekt, eller vad? Senare enstaka Venezuela/Colombia och mot morgonen bl. a. Ett par från Dominikanska Republiken på högre frekvenser.

6/3 var det WEGA i stället för R Buenos Aires på 1350 – ett tecken så gott som något på helt ändrade konditioner. Några enstaka La Plata under tidigare delen av natten. Sedan var 255-gradaren bara "fel" - det gick en del Västindien (PR), någon Colombia och Venezuela, t o m en NA (WQBA 1140), men allt splattrat, svagt och dåligt.

7/3 låg jag kvar på vad jag trodde 255 grader. Men det visade sig snart att antennreparationerna tidigare under dagen visserligen lett till att 285/105 grader nu fungerar. Men 255 grader var i stället backriktningen 75 och 205 grader borta. Lite "tröst" dock – jag hittade en för mig ny australier (1152)

8/3 Australien på 1152 gick även den här kvällen – annars mycket färre asiater. Radio Six Internationals test från Frankrike "with one million Watts" gick förstås utmärkt trots att min antenn pekade åt fel håll.

9/3 var det "nypremiär" för 285-gradaren som under lördagen fått en sista översyn efter jul- och nyårshelgens stormar och bl.a. försetts med ny transformator. Nu fungerade den, liksom backriktningen 105 grader. Om det var konditionerna eller antennjusteringen som gav mest resultat lär vi aldrig få veta, men det var vassa signaler framför allt mot Ecuador och Colombia, innan det falnade i gryningen.

10/3 betydligt sämre än dagen innan. Mycket mera störningar och svagare och färre signaler. Mycket Puerto Rico i början av natten, sedan mer Colombia men vid 02-03 faktiskt också några Argentina trots 285-graders antenn.

Göran Karlsson 15.3.2026:

Skickar över några tips i säsongens elfte timme. Nu är den sista snön borta, och snart kan man se bönderna i full aktivitet ute på åkrarna. Nu måste trådarna ner, tyvärr.

Stefan Wikander 15.3.2026:

Australia

Update on 2QN AM to FM conversion.

Latest info I have is that **1521** AM will be retained (for fringe area coverage) whilst allowing **2QN** to broadcast on 106.1 for the main Deniliquin area. This seems a significant shift in ACMA policy allowing broadcasters to keep the AM (it NOT really being an AM to FM conversion in the true sense).

The **ABC** has confirmed the date for its switch to FM in Perth, according to the following post from the **ABC Perth** Facebook page: "ABC Radio listeners in Perth will experience significantly improved audio quality, from 23 February, when **ABC Radio Perth** switches from **720** AM transmission to 102.5 FM." "The **ABC Radio Perth** and **Radio National** AM services will cease shortly after our FM broadcasts are fully operational. **NewsRadio** will continue to simulcast on **585** AM for now."

Alek Zapara in Western Australia reported on 10 February that **ABC** had reduced their **720** AM transmitter power or radiation pattern significantly in preparation for the FM switchover on 23 February. There were reports of much weaker reception east of Perth. (via ICDX-AM io Group) [Can't recall another example of this tactic to encourage listeners to make an early switch to the FM channel!]

With the ABC's three Perth radio stations switching from AM over to the FM band, it is the end of an era for the 94-year-old transmitter in **Hamersley**. While it is a well-known landmark in Perth's northern suburbs, Trevor Kelly has had a view of the **Hamersley** transmitter few others have. He started working as a radio technician for the ABC in 1959, as a trainee with the Postmaster General (PMG), which then handled all the ABC's technical broadcasting requirements. "We were taken out to **6WF, Hamersley** — out in the sticks — and we were shown the transmitters," he said "The **ABC 6WF** transmitter was one built in about 1932 by the PMG itself. When Mr Kelly and the other trainees said yes, they were given permission but also instructions on how to do it without electrocuting themselves. "They said, 'Just be very careful when you get on; you've got to jump on, not touch the ground and the mast at the same time, otherwise you'll be electrified,' that was the word that was used then," he said. "So we all jumped on, and as you jumped on, there was a zip as you touched on there. "Eleven of us managed to get up to the top, but you couldn't go right to the top because again, you got electrified there. "Anyhow, we all got down and it was a memorable day."



It has been many decades since **ABC** staff were allowed to risk electrocution at work, and now, the site's days providing AM broadcasting are drawing to a close. ABC Radio Perth, **NewsRadio** and **Radio National** will all move to frequencies on the FM band on February 23. The move will mean "many more people can tune into the station" as well as hear a clearer sound, radio futurologist James Cridland said. Mr Cridland, who also edits a daily podcast newsletter, said he thought the switch for ABC Radio Perth from AM to FM would be really good for the **ABC**.

Perth is the first capital city in Australia to move all stations to FM, a move that matches global trends. "If you look into Europe, most of the big broadcasters have now left the AM band," he said. "Japan is just turning off AM for one of its national broadcasters. In much of the US, they are trying, as quickly as they can, to shift over to FM. Crucially, moving to FM will boost listening in cars, a key audience for all radio stations. "New electric cars have no AM [receiver] in them. They're pulling AM out of some hybrid cars as well," Mr Cridland said. "We here in Australia get the European version of cars in terms of the in-car entertainment, and AM is not a thing in most of Europe, in much of the UK, so car manufacturers have no reason really to put it into their cars anymore."

Due to legislation that stipulates **NewsRadio** must broadcast parliament on AM radio, that station will be simulcast on both bands until the law can be amended. Mr Cridland said while AM still had a crucial place in regional Australia, where it can reach vast distances and is less susceptible to interference than it is in the city, FM made much more sense in the city. "[In cities] we live in suburbs. We commute into the CBD. You don't need a large transmitter to do that," he said. "What you need is a transmitter that people can actually pick up the signals from in their car and in their house. And more and more these days, that's FM and not AM. "It's something that, frankly, the ABC should be doing in all of the capital cities." (ABC website 15/2 via James Cridland's 'Radioland' newsletter 16/2) Following a 6 week simulcast period on both AM and FM, from Monday 6 April 2026, **ABC Perth (720)** and **ABC Radio National (810)** will no longer be available on AM in Perth. **ABC NewsRadio** will continue to broadcast on its AM service, as well as FM. Finland

A new rock-based radio station, ZoomRock FM, has started broadcasting in **Turku** at the beginning of February. The station operates on the medium wave band at a frequency of **1242 kHz**. This is the wave band where, among others, Radio Luxembourg once broadcast and was also widely listened to in Finland on mobile radios in the 1970s-90s. Behind the new station is local radio veteran **Harri Kujala**, who once worked at radio station *Auran Aalto* for 28 years.

ZoomRock's broadcast is particularly well heard in cars within a range of about 10–25 kilometers in **Turku** and the surrounding area. During darkness, the signal is reflected from the ionosphere hundreds of kilometers away, even outside Finland. The broadcast is mono and the audio band is narrower than in FM broadcasts.



The medium wave band is being phased out in European broadcasting, but it is still found in most car radios, as well as almost all portable radios and home stereos. On receivers it is usually marked MW or AM. The reason for operating on medium waves is the moderate copyright fees for music, which enable hobby-based radio operations in this area. **ZoomRock** will broadcast the program until the end of April with a temporary three-month license. The Radio Act stipulates that after that, there must be a one-month break before a new three-month period.

During the spring test broadcast, the station will broadcast non-stop rock music, and those interested can also receive free advertising on a trial basis during this time. **ZoomRock** is aimed at men over 50 who like guitar-based, light and melodic rock music. The music is based on seven decades of rock classics. Blues and prog are on the playlist, but heavy metal is not heard on the airwaves.

France

Given the incessant closure of MW stations, Radio Six International **1467 kHz** wants, in its own small way, to do something constructive about it. For many years now we've had regular broadcasts on shortwave (latterly an hour every Saturday night) but we are hoping to switch to medium wave across Europe. Not easy, we know, as although even very low powered stations like **Chichester Hospital Radio** appear in the Eurolog, we want to make the listening experience easy and comfortable for as much of Europe as possible. So we're doing a test on SATURDAY 7th MARCH between 23:00 and 00:00 GMT. The transmitter is at **Roumoules** in France, the power is 1,000 kW [that's 1000 kW /Ed] and the beam is 325 degrees. That ought to provide a decent signal on small ferrite aerials in most of the continent except the Netherlands, where stations like **Radio Paradijs** use the same frequency. Do let us know what reception is like via the group message board. If the results of the test are encouraging, we plan a weekly programme at this time on this transmitter. Medium wave is not dead!

The rest are working, which reached my receiver during the scan in Hungary (**558**, **585**, **621**, **657**, **666**, **738**, **702**, **747**, **756**, **801**, **828**, **837**, **846**, **900**, **936**, **945**, **972**, **1008** (distorted!), **1026**, **1062**, **1071**, **1188**, **1197**, **1278**, **1305**, **1332**, **1341**, **1467**, **1476** and **1512**).

Some regionals airing the **Radio Iran** program, some are broadcasting the usual joint nightly program. **R. Quran (900 kHz)**, **R. Maaref (1071 kHz)** and **R. Payam (1188 kHz)** are airing their own programs.

Iran observations 1st + 2nd March:

On 1st of March, most of the stations were airing common programmes: The national ones stuck together as well as the province's outlets did on their own. On the bottom of the hour, the time signal and chimes by **Radio Iran** were taken over (heard on **774 kHz Markazi**). Yesterday (2nd of March), the ID was neutral, giving the time signal for the capital ("Tehranast"), not naming **Radio Iran** (also heard on **774**). It was the same on all local outlets receivable here, without ChB on **756** which obviously relayed **Radio Iran (756** was = **558**). All others (**819**, **927**, **936**, **657**, **774**, **1026**, **1512**) carried the "neutral" programming yesterday but with some heavy delay between each other. **Kurdistan (945 kHz** plus 2 repeaters and FM) had own programming on both days with chimes and ID in kurdish on the bottom of the hour and "sirens" in the back.

Quran Radio on **900** had coran singings, not taken over **Radio Iran** last night (when I checked). This seems to be different from the day before. What is even more interesting: When I was looking for **Kermanshah** upon **864 kHz** around 2321 CET = 2221 UTC, I heard a **clandestine** broadcast towards Iran, probably from **Armenia**. The style was the same as it can be heard each afternoon on this frequency (unlisted on MWLIST). The afternoon programme is called "**Radio Iran Azad**" and is identifying with frequency and the song "Ey Iran" and has mostly news and current affair programmms with little music. The evening programme could not be identified but might originate from the same site. It was 100% talk px.

IRIB German Service now available on Medium Wave. Iranian State Broadcaster "Voice of Islamic Republic Iran" is airing its German Language Foreign Service on Medium Wave recently:

First observed on 26 Feb 2026 between 1852 and 1928 CET (1752-1828 UTC) on **639 kHz**, also heard there on 28 Feb. (it is there at least since 21st or 23rd, when the Spanish program was observed about two hours later – according to mediumwave.info, the English service is also there) giving it a schedule : first **German**, followed by **English** (from 1830 UTC) and than **Spanish** (from 1930 UTC).

Today (3rd March) the **German Service** was launched at 1928 CET (1828 UTC) but on **702 kHz** (!) with the opening sequence and welcoming. usually, this frequency s/off after the armenian px. This is quite surprising, as the **IRIB** German Feed is not even available on Shortwave any longer (as far as I know). Certainly, this is due to on-going events. I could not find any information regarding this new German broadcast.

I heard the **German Service** of IRIB on the **702 kHz** already Sunday, March 1 opening with Intervall signal about 18:20 UT followed by the standard German programs. One day later it came about half an hour later. I observed no interference from **BBC Farsi** on this frequency here at my QTH in Fürth/Germany.

Iran observations 3 March:

Many Iranians were audible last night in Europe, even some I have never heard before like national Radio Iran on 1548 and 1557. Missing here: 1278 Kermanshah (blocked by Ukraine), 1197 Ardabil, 972/1395 Ilam and 1368/1539 Golestan. Might have been there but not heard. **Kerman** and **Quizvin** are NOT audible here most of the time.

Radio Yazd 747 kHz was opting out from the central programme of all regional stations around 22:20 UTC in the middle of the broadcast. Radio Quran 900 kHz had its own programming (Imam) with frequency ID announcement at 2227 UTC. **Radio ChB 756 kHz** gave a voice ID at 2232 UTC, introducing its own follow-up programme. Payam 1188 and Tehran 1332 followed their own schedule.



Definitely active were 558 (at least 3 or more transmitters causing echoes), 585, 900, 1071, 1188, 1332 plus the regional outlets on 657, 747, 756, 774, 783, 801, 819, 837, 873 (not **Tabriz**), 891, 927, 936, 945, 981 (strong!), 1026, 1062, 1467, 1494 and 1512. 864 (clandestine broadcast in Persian towards Iran, presumed originating from **Armenia**) had a current reports programme with interviews around 2218 UTC. (*ParadiseFM via Ydun's MW-Info 04.03.2026*)

At 06.03.2026 IRIB TV1 sound was broadcasted on 900 kHz during the evening instead of **IRIB R. Quran**, the normal programming (Quran) was back at 2130 UTC. By the way, almost all **IRIB** stations are on air, including **Ilam**, **Kordestan** and **Golestan**, which missed during the previous scan. The programmings are slightly changed – less patriotic chants, more Quran recitations and soft instrumental music – as I observed. (*Tringer László HNG to Ydun's MW-Info 06.03.2026*)

After the “bubble jammer” switched off, today I observed TWO regionals on 1548 kHz against **VOA Farsi**. I heard the joint regional program with slight echo, so at least two regional stations are working on it, (**R. Kahavaran** listed). Radio Iran was present too on 1548 under the mess, I identified it using headphones. So there is a **new method for jamming** in Iran: moving regional stations to the desired frequency. Radio Ilam did the same, it moved to 1395 kHz from 1044 kHz and caused interference on stations broadcasting from **Armenia** on this frequency. (*Tringer László HNG to Ydun's MW-Info 07.03.2026*)

Now (08.03.2026 – 2035 UTC) IRIB R. Kermanshah off air on 1278 kHz (864 and 1377 are blocked with other stations). IRIB R. Ardabil has a silent carrier on 1197 kHz, but working well on 1512 kHz. The rest are on air. Interesting fact, that Radio Farhang (585 kHz) is broadcasting its own programme. (*Tringer László to Ydun's MW-Info 08.03.2026*)

Additional BBC **MW broadcasts** to Iran.

Alongside the existing 702 (from **Oman**) and 1395 (from **Armenia**), the **BBC** has now added 720 (from **Cyprus**) and 1296 (from **Tajikistan**) for its Persian broadcasts. (*Chris Greenway to WOR iog 12.03.2026*)

On 18 February, Simon Hill in **Christchurch** found that **The Breeze** was missing from **738 AM**, and the frequency remains silent as at 25 February. The AM outlet is no longer listed on websites associated with **MediaWorks**, but is still listed on other sources like Wikipedia. **MediaWorks** runs many of New Zealand's biggest and most popular music stations, including **The Breeze**, **More FM**, **The Rock** and **Mai FM** but it now appears to have just one remaining AM operation – **Humm FM** on **702** in **Auckland**.

The low power AM licence on **1449 kHz** at **Lower Hutt**, reportedly with a power of 25 Watts, began transmission on 14 February and was heard relaying NZME station **George FM** on a **Lower Hutt** KiwiSDR, but inaudible on other publicly available KiwiSDRs in the **Wellington**, **Wairarapa**, **Marlborough** or **Tasman** regions. North Otago DXer David Headland was able to get a borderline audio signal on **1449** near **Oamaru** before **SEN Mandurah** covered it. David Kaio was first member to confirm transmissions were in QAM mode, as his screenshot from the **Lower Hutt** KiwiSDR shows.

Pakistan

The Medium Wave radio station in Larkana has been off air since January 2026, while the Pakistan Broadcasting Corporation (PBC) headquarters has failed to respond to repeated requests and correspondence from local officials. Sources at **PBC House Larkana** told Dawn on Wednesday that the 100-kilowatt transmitter installed at **Chuharpur** village has been lying idle due to a fault. Transmission on **1053 kilohertz** Medium Wave has remained suspended.



In a letter dated Jan 14, 2026, the In-charge of the **High Power Transmitter (HPT)** in **Larkana** informed **PBC headquarters** that the Medium Wave transmitter developed a fault during routine operation at 9pm on Jan 12, 2026. The main power supply from the grid station tripped, which caused the transmitter to go off air. Sources said the transmitter had already been facing continuous faults, reducing its output from 100 kW to between 15 and 20 kW.

The Frequency Modulation (FM) transmitter, installed in **Larkana** in 1995, has also been affected after the shifting of its tower from **PBC Larkana** to the High Power Transmitter relay station in **Chuharpur** in 2025. A PBC official described the Medium Wave transmitter as being “on ventilator”. Sources said the relocation of the **Studio Transmission Link (STL)** from its original site in **Larkana** to the HPT had also disrupted FM 101.4 transmissions.

Another source at the HPT said the transmitter's motherboard developed a fault in 2021 and has not been replaced since. No spare parts have been supplied since 2017 to handle emergencies, the sources added. “We do not have the funds to set things right,” a radio official told this correspondent. In a written communication to the **Deputy Controller HPT Landhi**, the **Deputy Controller HPT Larkana** stated that on Jan 13, 2026 voltage fluctuations were observed in the main power supply, causing noise in the three-phase AVR system. A complaint was lodged with the Line Superintendent of SEPCO Larkana Subdivision. The fault was resolved after sunset and voltage stabilised. However, when attempts were made to restore transmission, the transmitter failed to remain on air. He further stated that no power supply readings were available in the circuit, and the matter was reported to the **Regional Coordinator** (Sindh).

The communication added that the main AUI system of the transmitter has remained out of circuit since 2021 due to the faulty motherboard, resulting in a complete loss of transmitter monitoring. Listeners have urged the federal government to intervene and ensure the early restoration of the Medium Wave transmission of **PBC Larkana**.

On November 22, 1999, the WOW call letters were dropped in favor of KOMJ with adoption of a new format of adult standards branded as "Magic 590".

On April 25, 2005, KOMJ and then-sister station KOSR-1490 swapped formats, with KOMJ adopting the sports format (as "Big Sports 590") with new call letters KXSP, and 1490 adopting the standards format and KOMJ callsign. (Wikipedia)

AFRS stations in the field I:

I. From the USS Texas via American Expeditionary Stations (AES) in North Africa to the Italian boot.

Before the "American Forces Network" (AFN) brand was started with AFN London, the stations in the Mediterranean theater operated under the banner of **AES: American Expeditionary Stations**.

After the **USS Texas** broadcasts during "Operation Torch" around 600 kHz in November, 1942, the first land-based AES station was established in **Casablanca** on 1080/1086 kHz, 1 kW. Utilizing a captured local transmitter and improvised studios, it began broadcasting to the troops on December 14, 1942. This was followed rapidly by stations in **Algiers**(983.5, 8000 kHz, 1 kW/250w, May 1943), **Constantine**(1080 kHz? May 1943), **Oujda**(? kHz, May 1943), and **Tunis**(1210 kHz, 300w, August 1943). Also a station in **Bizerte** is indicated. Constantine had closed by summer 1944 and by August it had moved to **Oran**(652/1402, 9560 kHz). According to JER/Jan Erik Räf Constantine was heard in Sweden on **1080**:

"...angående 1080 Constantine, Algeria: Min identifikation av stationen closing down at 23.20 with American ID and Star-Spangled Banner. Det var TROLIGEN...AES Casablanca jag hörde. Men helt säkert vet jag inte: runt den här frekvensen hörde jag några gånger åtminstone två stationer av typ AFRS, varav en säkerligen var Constantine..."

II. Key US Armies and Formations:

The First Army(Omar Bradley) was the primary American field army in the European Theater of Operations(ETO), landing in Normandy on D-Day (June 6, 1944). Led by Courtney Hodges from August 1944, it spearheaded the liberation of Paris, broke the Siegfried Line, and was the first to cross the Rhine.

The Third Army(George S. Patton) was a rapidly moving armored force operational in Europe from August 1944. Renowned for its speed and aggression, it spearheaded the breakout from Normandy, liberated much of France, played a crucial role in relieving Bastogne during the Battle of the Bulge in December 1944, and pushed into Germany, Austria, and Czechoslovakia.

The Fifth Army(Mark Clark), activated on January 5, 1943, in North Africa was instrumental in the Italian Campaign. It conducted the Salerno landing in September 1943, fought through heavily fortified German defensive lines, and was pivotal in the liberation of Rome.

The Seventh Army(George S. Patton) was the first American field army to see combat in WW2, playing a critical role in the Mediterranean and European theaters. Activated in July 1943, it launched the Sicily invasion, later spearheaded the invasion of southern France, and concluded by capturing major cities like Nürnberg and Munich in Germany.

The Ninth Army(William Simpson): Originally Eighth Army, fought in Northwest Europe in 1944 and 1945.

The 6th Army Group(Jacob L. Devers) was an Allied army group that fought in the ETO during WW2. Made up of field armies from both the United States and France, it fought in France, Germany, Austria, and, briefly, Italy.

The 12th Army Group (Omar Bradley): Active from Aug 1944 to July 1945, comprising the First, Third, Ninth, and Fifteenth U.S. Armies.

The 15th Army Group¹(British General Harold Alexander) was a major Allied operational command in World War II (1943–1945), primarily responsible for the Italian Campaign. It was composed of the US Fifth Army and British Eighth Army.

Major Operations:

Invasion of Sicily: (1943): Operation Husky.

Invasion of Italy (1943): Landings at Salerno (Operation Avalanche).

Battles for Rome (1944): Including the Battle of Monte Cassino and the Anzio beachhead.

Gothic Line/Spring 1945 Offensive: Final breakthrough in Northern Italy. German surrender in Italy in May 1945.

¹ **Distinct from "Fifteenth United States Army"**: The 15th Army Group is often confused with the Fifteenth United States Army (15th Army), a separate entity that served in Northwestern Europe in 1944–1945, commanding troops in the Ruhr Pocket and managing occupation duties.

III. The Road to Rome: AES Palermo and the "Fifth Army" radio station:

The invasion of Sicily (July 1943) introduced American Forces Radio in Southern Europe. Upon the capture of Palermo, the AFRS established a station in August 1943 using the facilities of the Italian state broadcaster. The Allied invasion of the Italian mainland took place from September 3rd, 1943. The operation was undertaken by General Sir Harold Alexander's 15th Army Group (comprising General Mark W. Clark's American Fifth Army and General Bernard Montgomery's British Eighth Army) and followed the successful invasion of Sicily. A preliminary landing in Calabria (Operation Baytown) took place on 3 September, the main invasion force landed on the west coast of Italy at Salerno on 9 September at the same time as a supporting operation at Taranto (Operation Slapstick). As the war moved to the Italian mainland with the Salerno landing the **AFRS Fifth Army Radio Station** which also had been established in Sicily became a "rolling" radio station: Instead of waiting weeks to secure a building and erect a tower, the broadcasters went ashore broadcasting on the road.

IV. 1280/1500/1510/1530 kHz AFRS Fifth Army Expeditionary Station.

This tactical, mobile unit kept up with the fast-moving front lines of General Mark Clark's **U.S. Fifth Army**, constantly advancing through rugged Italian terrain. Under its Officer-in-Charge, Lt. Vern Carstensen, the 5th Army Mobile Radio Station followed the frontline troops during the remainder of the Italian campaign, and operated with great success.

The station was housed in 2.5-ton trucks. This allowed the station to pack up and move within hours to stay within range of the troops. While the SCR-299 transmitter was technically a high-power mobile *communications* unit (usually for Morse code or voice command), the Signal Corps modified these units—or used similar RCA-built 1,000-watt transmitters—to broadcast high-quality AM radio.

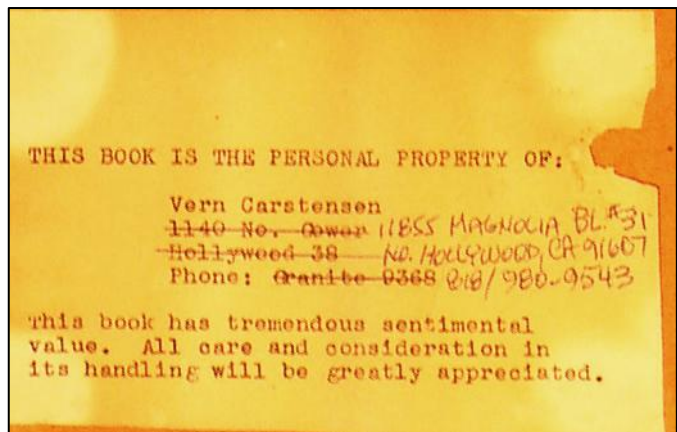
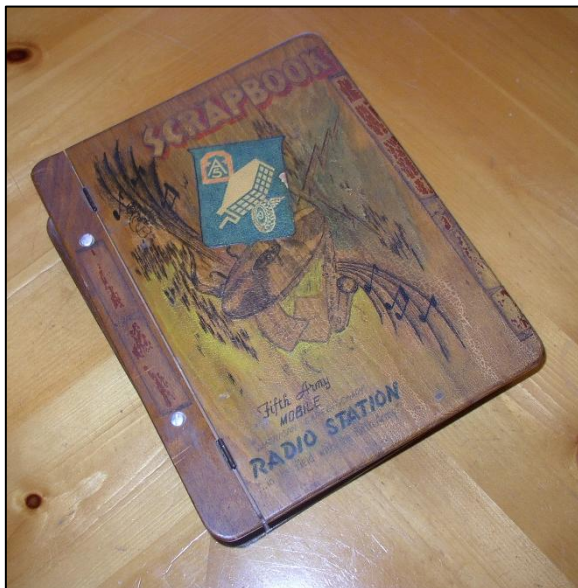

695	Rome(Roma)	5000W	Established Aug.14th, 1944, 10 days after the liberation of Rome. It served as the "mother station" for the synchronized network
1276	Milan (Milano)	5000W	Captured after the liberation of Milan in April 1945. It served as the primary hub for the massive occupation force in Northern Italy.

1321	Montecatini	400W	Montecatini Terme was a famous spa town that became the headquarters for the U.S. Fifth Army and a primary rest and recreation center. The station covered the numerous hotels and hospitals converted for soldier use.
1402	Florence(Firenze)	400W	Served the troops of the U.S. Fifth Army during the final push into Northern Italy and the subsequent occupation.
1438	Leghorn (Livorno)	250W	A primary logistical port for the Allies. The station served the massive number of personnel involved in moving supplies and troops through the harbour.
1492	Foggia	1000W	Target 15th Air Force. Foggia was a massive complex of airfields, and the high wattage ensured coverage for airmen across the plains of Puglia.

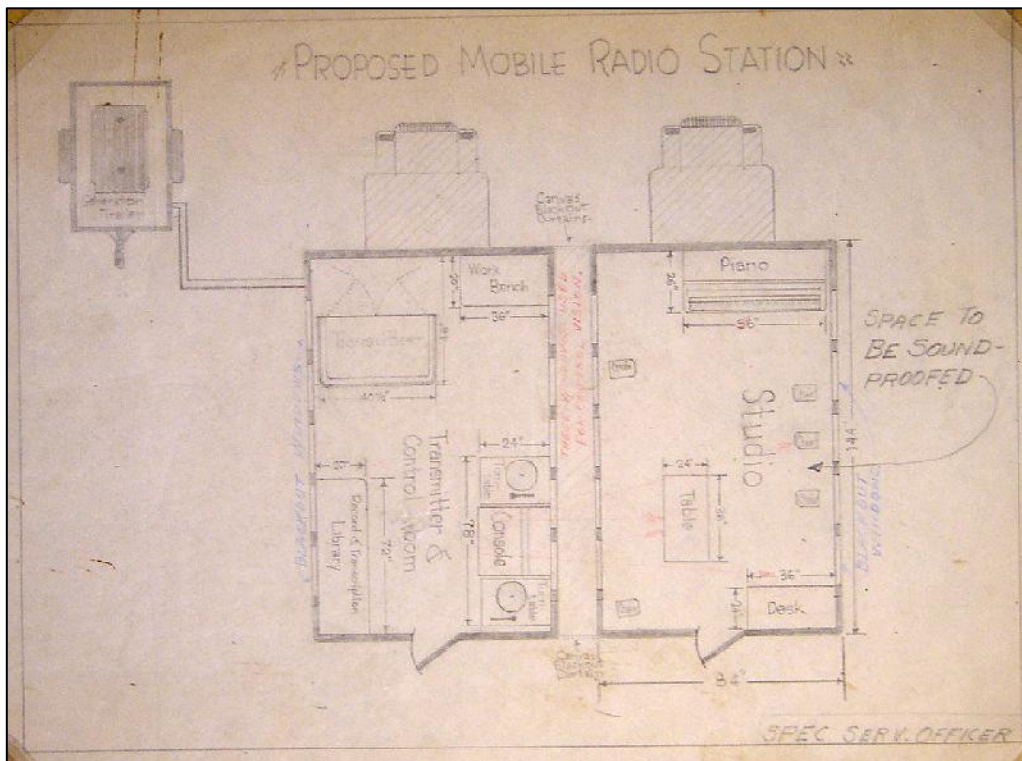
Addendum I: 5th Army Mobile Radio Station by Jim Carstensen:

In late 2007, the editor heard from Jim Carstensen, son of Vern Carstensen of the 5th Army Mobile Radio Station. Vern was a First Lieutenant in the United States Army during World War II, and he was assigned to head up the Fifth Army Mobile Radio Station. Vern was later with the Armed Forces Radio in Asmara and is also pictured in that chapter of this series. In 1992 Vern recorded an interview for the Pacific Pioneer Broadcasters group. In an interview he talks in great detail about the 5th Army Mobile Radio Station and what he did during the war. His son Jim very kindly offered us the material you may enjoy in greater detail from his fine [site](#). Jim adds his website is dedicated to his dad, and to all the brave men and women who are now or have ever served in the U.S. Armed Forces.



Vern has left a detailed Scrapbook of his experiences with newspaper clippings, photographs, autographs, and other memorabilia from the radio station and his adventures during the war.

The station consisted of two trailers; one housed the studio and the other contained the transmitter. The station was mobile so that it could pick up, move, and be reassembled in as little as two hours as the fighting advanced.

The 5th Army Mobile Radio Station was created to boost morale amongst the troops. Music, news from home, live concerts and variety shows were produced and broadcast from a mobile platform. Above is a larger photo of the studio.

The idea of a rolling radio station is said to be invented by Maj. Francis McAloon in North Africa sometime early in 1943. The station was fabricated mostly from captured German and Italian equipment. Being the army many things were improvised, such as the powered-egg and ration cans being used for fixtures and "On-The-Air" indicators. The transmitter was designed to have a broadcast radius of about 50 miles, and they always tried to perch on the highest point possible. Unfortunately, this made them more vulnerable to enemy fire and sometimes the German bombers would "follow their signal in" and attempt to knock them off the air. Fortunately, nothing ever tragic happened.

The station traveled mostly around Italy for almost two years. During that time Vern Carstensen received the Bronze Star and got commissioned in 1945 to the rank of Captain.

Many famous stars of the time participated in the entertainment. In fact, a club of sorts was formed called "Old Oaken Bucket" Club. Members were inducted into the club whenever they performed or their song was requested to play on the program. The scrapbook contains many letters from members of the club, including Jimmy Durante, Bill Crosby, and W.C. Fields.

One of the hundreds of songs that Irving Berlin wrote during this time was "The Fifth Army's Where My Heart Is". Needless to say, the song was played regularly on the 5th Army Radio Program. The scrapbook contains a copy of the sheet music autographed by Irving Berlin.

FM: The US presence moved toward permanent bases like Aviano and Sigonella, eventually broadcasting moved to the FM-based **American Forces Network (AFN)** we know today. These stations are not covered here.

Addendum III. Key Points:

During the Italian Campaign, the AFRS stations were organized into color-coded synchronized networks—primarily the **Purple Network** and the **Blue Network**.

The Station IDs

In the 1940s, the "call sign" was simply the station's geographic identifier or its army affiliation. Listeners would hear announcements such as:

"**This is AES Naples, the voice of the Blue Network.**"
"**You are listening to Station 5, your Fifth Army Expeditionary Station.**"
"**This is AES Caserta, flagship of the Purple Network.**"

Content: The stations broadcast a mix of "transcription discs" (pre-recorded shows from the U.S. like Glenn Miller or Bob Hope) and local live shows. The AFRS in Italy was a training ground for several men who became legendary in broadcasting and entertainment.

History of Radio in Costa Rica (85): Radio Tic-Tac

Radio Tic-Tac is one of the stations with very few information. It was owned by Arnaldo Vargas Vargas, operating on 600 kHz. It seems that the station was inaugurated in 1960.

The station obtained the first rank in the listening survey conducted in May 1969.

Entering in 1975 it was reported that they would change the station name under a new director Carlos Eduardo Gómez. In fact, as early as in March 1975, they adopted a traditional name of Radio Para Tí.

Visst, om man vill krångla till det.

Det finns klart värre:

FM Translators -- vem i hela världen kan bry sig om det?

Utom yrkesfolk som tvingats anpassa sig till marknaden (alltså vi människor), dels myndigheter som vill bestämma över marknaden och sist vi som vill lyssna.

Typ jag, som tills häromdagen inte brytt mig en jota om FM translators, ända tills jag skulle kolla en antennvariant (vilket är för långt för att ens försöka förklara) och hamnade på 1550 kHz och då fick höra följande:

** Alla era loggar med FM translators, elegant Excel-samlade av TN, är smått röriga. De, typ, spretar och de stämmer framför allt inte med det jag hör tydligt -- utom de där bokstäverna på sista translatorn: "DV", är fonetiskt svår och det kan vara TB, CV, CB, DB, VB, you name it.

Men det är inte problemet, det riktiga problemet är att ingen station i Miami, *"from Palm Beach to the Keys"* använder någon att dessa translators.

670 WMYM = 98.7, W254UK

990 WWFE = 103.1 W276DV

1550 WRHC = 98.7, W254DV, men använder ofta de andra FM-reläer."

"Salem Media Group is shuffling programming at its stations in Miami. Spanish Conservative Talk "La Poderosa" has moved from 670 WWFE/103.1 W276DV and 1550 WRHC/98.7 W254DV to 990

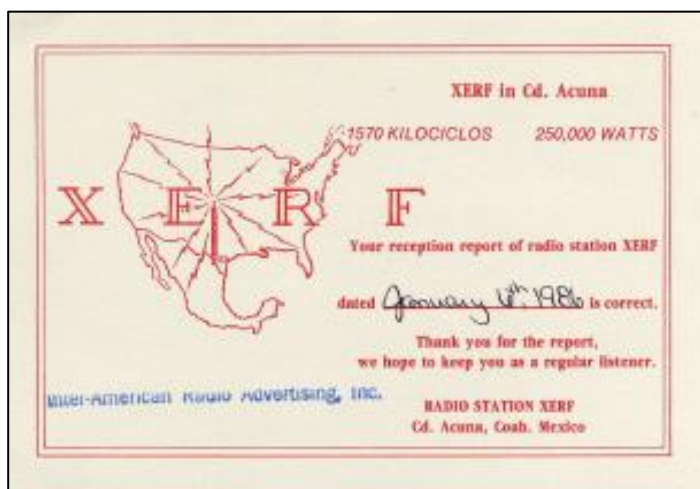
WMYM/98.7 W254DT and flipped WWFE and WRHC to Salem's core Christian Preaching format as "The Word".

XERF and XERA

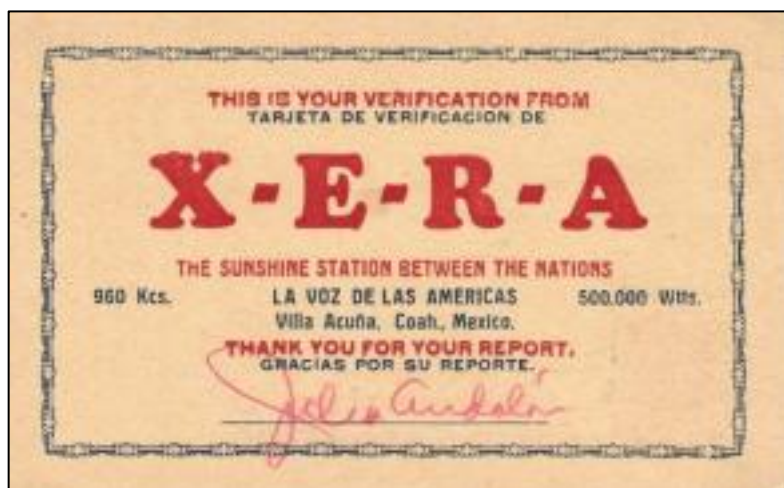
A musing from Jon Pearkins, Edmonton AB to NRC DX News 93-12

Hearing XERF last night reminds me of the history of the station and previous high powered stations in the border town of Ciudad Acuña. Mostly, I think about Wolfman Jack and how widely he was heard on the 250 kW XERF in the 1960s, influencing so many people's lives. I know of two DJs who passed away here in Edmonton in the last 20 years who name The Wolfman as their major influence as teens. One even considered Wolfman as his favorite DJ of all time. It is easy to forget just how clear 1570 was at night in the U.S. in the 1960s. Even the Vane Jones



1970 log shows nothing but daytimers on 1570 in the U.S. XERF co-founder (in 1947) Arturo González was able to convince anyone who felt they had to reach every last person in the continental U.S. that XERF could deliver. And the cost really did not matter, as it paled in comparison to the alternative: dozens of U.S. stations. Not to mention the fact that U.S. stations could lose their license airing some of XERF's paid programs, as they violated FCC regulations. Arturo explained that once night-time operation on 1570 was allowed across the U.S. in the mid-1980s, the station was no longer a viable business, unable to reach every home in America. He agreed to the sale of the station to the Mexican government's Instituto Mexicano de la Radio in 1986.

Prior to World War II, Ciudad Acuña was home to an even more powerful station, XERA, which had the same model transmitter that WLW used for its years in the 1930s with 500 kW. But the owner, John R. Brinkley, better known as the goat gland doctor, wanted more power than WLW.



Creating a broad North directional pattern, XERA effectively broadcast with a million watts into the U.S. XERA caused such havoc on U.S. and even Canadian stations that it forced both countries to support the Mexican clear channels in the North American Regional Broadcasting Agreement (NARBA), which was signed at the end of 1937 and came into effect in 1941. Even before XERA, there was XER, which Dr. Brinkley founded in Ciudad Acuña in 1932 after the Federal Radio

Commission (predecessor of the FCC) refused to renew his license for KFKB. The FCC began their investigation of KFKB's questionable programming after Dr. Brinkley lost his medical license. He had put KFKB on the air in 1923, in Milford, Kansas, where his goat gland clinic was originally located.

I remind you that I was born in Argentina and have lived in Italy for 60 years.

Prompted by TN, I'll tell you that these nearly 1,500 pages "exploded" in my hands, with over 60 collaborators: Argentinians, English, and Islanders. A huge undertaking, involving contacts and translations.



We couldn't help but mention radio (briefly), recalling the propaganda stations *Radio Liberty* and *Radio Atlántico del Sur*, and the 12 hours spent at the microphone of *FIBS* on April 2, 1982, by Patrick Watts, who later became the station's director. Patrick Watts wrote the preface for my third book: an interesting overview of the political situation in the Falklands from 1971 to the 1982 war.

An anecdote: *"Due Calvi per un Pettine"* or *"Two Bald Men for a Comb"* (paraphrasing Jorge Luis Borges) is now the fitting culmination of a project that never came to fruition but was conceived as a couple in 2009, as we approached the ten thousandth day of the 1982 war. It was born from an agreement based on mutual interests, between the late HK and me: he would deal with geopolitics, psychological operations, and signals intelligence (PSYOP & SIGINT), while I would handle the audio recordings of the time for publication on the Web. Above all, my work commitments abroad had prevented me from completing it. Although much delayed, I have now completed that project from 17 years ago.



Among the collaborators I would like to mention Horacio A. Nigro, a well-known Uruguayan DXer. Over the years, with the *MCDXT – Mosquito Coast DX Team*, we have continued to maintain an active remote listening station - with Kiwi and Perseus options -, no longer in the historic Piancada location of twenty years ago, but now a little further East, in Centuria, overlooking the Grado Lagoon, near the Roman city of Aquileia. Radio listening has truly changed a lot, and perhaps (without a doubt) we have changed a little too: now our main focus is on Asian stations, with a 500-meter Beverage antenna trained on 60°C.

Last digression: with some friends I'm busy finishing another trilogy, this time a northern, or polar, one, about Umberto Nobile's North Pole exploits with Roald Amundsen, first in 1926 with the airship *Norge*, then alone in 1928 with the airship *Italia* (*the Red Tent*, the Russian icebreaker *Krassin*, etc.). The third book will be released in 2028, on the occasion of *Italy*'s centenary, but we still wanted to conclude the story of the *Norge* (the first book, in 2021) by trying to delve deeper into news, photos, and articles about the radio equipment of the *Norge* itself, which, as far as we know, had its original Marconi equipment replaced on Amundsen's orders to meet the needs of the Russian radio operator. Does anyone know about this? Is there any documentation on this subject? Thanks.

I conclude by recalling my nostalgic and fruitful "*business trips*" to Latin America, where the summary was taken from HK itself, all present in: < <https://www.dxinfo.se/Francesco.html> >

The 10,000 Days (since the War) Homepage I reposted was/should have been the audio content, that is, my portion of the work.

The written portion, like the libretto/booklet, was supposed to be HK's. I should have some of his preliminary drafts somewhere in the archives...

Unfortunately, he was very busy, and I was especially busy with constant travel abroad, constantly "on and off"... so the 10,000 Days (since the War) passed, and the project foundered (mostly, as I specified, because of me).

Another clarification: all the audio material collected up until then (and by me since) is still in the drawer, ready to be used, who knows, for some (hopefully) future initiative.

You may remember how much I've always enjoyed posting clips from various radio stations (Exotic Sounds) online.

Det fick mig att fundera på ett litet projekt att sammanställa alla PAX expeditioner i en sökbar Excelfil. Men vid den tidpunkten var Bosse inte så begestrad över detta.

Men i höstas hörde Bosse av sig och undrade om jag ville ha en kopia av en katalog med alla PAX-expeditioner för fritextsökning (c:a 63 MB totalt) för det fall Tore Larsson undrar om någon viss (silent) stn är hörd i Sverige.

Då jag gjort sammanställningsfiler av motsvarande art från MV-Eko så tänkte jag att det skall nog fixa sig ganska lätt. Men det som var lite problematiskt var att göra om alla rtf- och pdf-filer till tabellform. I rtf-filerna fanns tabblägen men inte i pdf-filerna. Speciellt de gamla pdf-filerna var lite kniviga att få till. Så en del extra handpåläggning behövdes för att få allt att passa in på rätt sätt i tabellform.

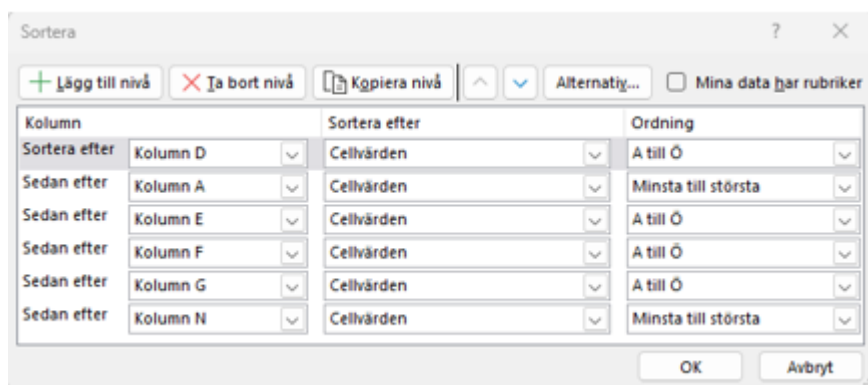
Vi behövde göra ett antal genomgångar av allt material för att korrigera felaktiga frekvenser, omkastade call och annat som inte stämde, mm. Bosse tog sig an NA och han stod för många rättelser då han hade klart för sig hur bandet såg ut. FD tog på sig att kolla CA/SA och lade till fiktiva call för att kunna sortera dessa områden på bästa sätt. Kvar att kolla lite mer noga är Japan.

Bosse hade också i sin plan att gå igenom alla callbyten för NA och checka alla stationer markerade med + tecken men tyvärr hanns det aldrig med. + tecknet är i filen ersatt av en asterisk * (ett plustecken i inledningen av en rad i Excel uppfattas som att en formel skall skrivas).

BOS ville också att alla understrykningar, fetstil, mm skulle tas bort.

Nu har jag felsökt genom att samköra materialet i Access och några sista rättelser har gjorts. Det är väl så långt jag kan komma och tycker det nu kan vara dags att göra denna sammanställning publik. Tar tacksamt emot ev. rättelser så kan filen uppdateras efterhand.

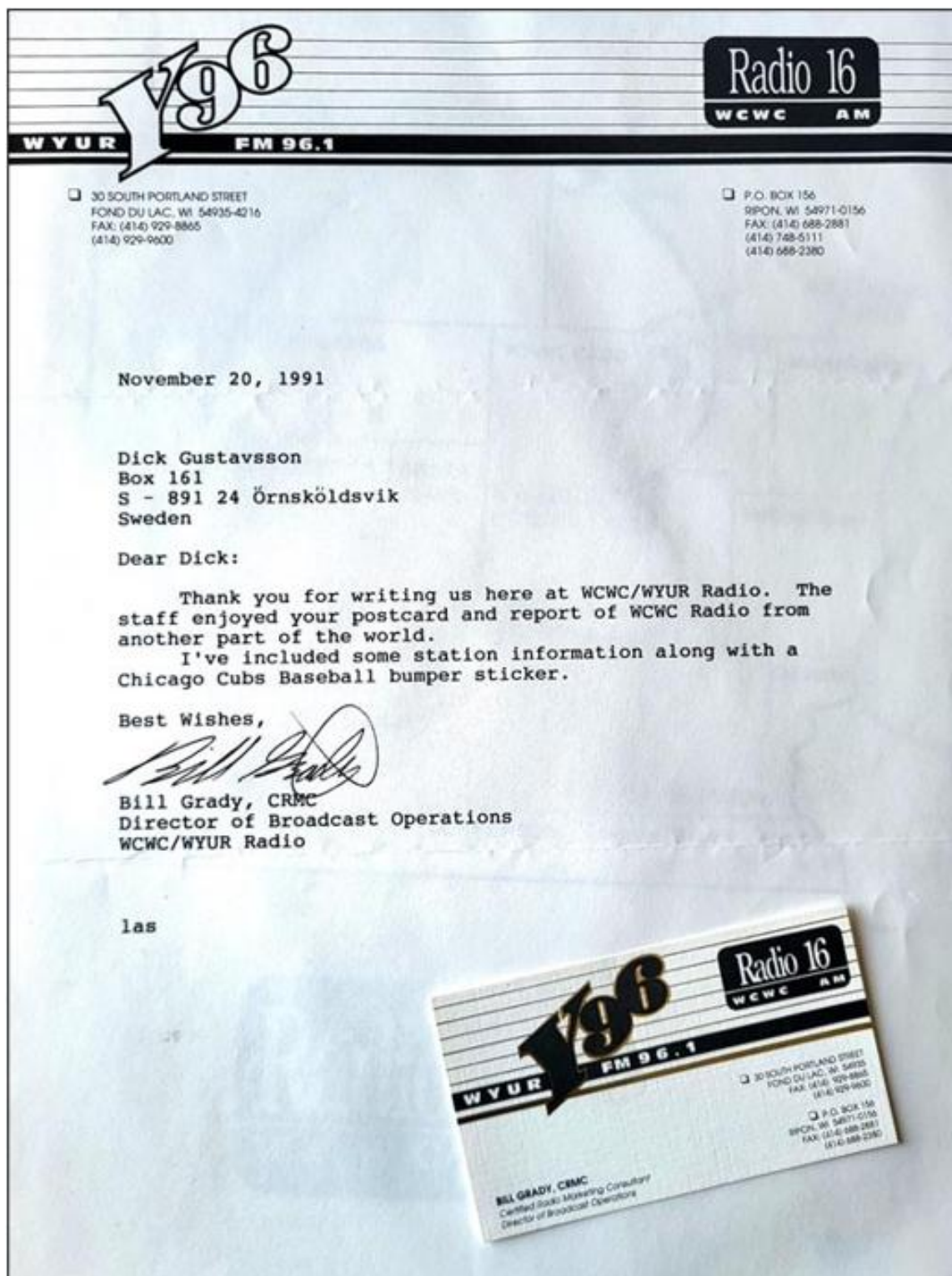

Det fanns en hel del att lyssna på från Holland redan innan dagens alla privata lågeffektade mellanvågsstationer kom till. Här mitt eget brev från Arrow Classic Rock på 828 kHz som hade ett njutbart rockformat. De bifogade även dekaler och diverse annat.



John Ekwall JOE har bidragit med några tidningsurklipp från ett album som Lars Henningson hade med sig en gång när Lars och Hasse Mattisson kom på besök. Till höger ser vi Bengt Dalhammar BD i början av DX-karriären. Hans Johansson till vänster: är det möjligen en MRS-are? Du LSD kanske vet? Den övre halvan i urklippet handlade om HCJB på kortvåg.



DX-PROFIL:

■ Det är en ganska utbredd uppfattning, att det går mycket dåligt att lyssna på utlandsradio inne i större städer och samhällen. Hans Johansson har emellertid svart på vitt på att det kan gå DX-a en hel del även mitt i Stockholm. Numera bor han vid St. Eriksgatan och tidigare bodde han vid Flemingsgatan, bågge platserna på Kungsholmen i hus med likström och med spårvagnar, trådbussar och annan störande gatutrafik utanför. Men han har i alla fall hundratals verifikationer från 90 olika länder. Bland de verif

fierade stationerna kan nämnas Paramaribo, Suriname, som då sände på 52,11 meter. Numera brukar Hans höra den på 15,405 kc/s = 19,48 meter, när konditionerna är gynnsamma. Xven Bissau, Portugisiska Guinea, på 5,838 kc/s, har skickat en verifikation till Hans.

Enligt World Radio Handbook sänder denna exklusiva station numera på 3,975 kc/s = 75,48 meter kl. 22.30-24.00.

Hans Johansson har varit DX-are sedan våren 1949, och han använder en AGA, 1772. Till den har han en 40 meter lång utomhusantenn. Sina verifikationer samlar han mycket ordentligt i fotoalbum, och vimplarna har han inom glas.



DX-PROFIL:

■ Bengt Dalhammar, Lidängö, hör till den yngre eliten bland DX-arna. Han började så sent som i februari 1954 då han råkade få in Canadas radio, Montreal, när han provade vad familjens nya radiogramfon gick för. Sedan dess har det blivit 400 verifikationer från 126 olika länder, ställiga vimplar från WRUL i New York, och de sydamerikanska stationerna Radio Bucaramanga, Emisora Sur America i Bogotá, Bauru Radio Clube i Brasillien, Radio Mayrink Veiga och Transmisora Veiga.

Till de mera svårfångade verifikationerna räknar han de han fått från Solomon Islands, Falklands-öarna, och Radio Oriental i Nicaragua.

I maj 1956 fick han helt oväntat en verifikation från Radio Addis Abeba i Etiopien i ett brev från Canada. Det visade sig, att Bengts verifikationskort hängt ihop med en canadensisk lyssnares och av misstag följt med till Canada. Detta blev upphov till en trevlig brevväxling mellan de bägge hobbykamraterna på ömse sidor om Atlanten. Bengt har för övrigt fått en brevvän även i Jordanien, en f. d. polischef i Jerusalem.


Sin tid delar Bengt just nu mellan plugget i gymnasiets tredje ring, medarbetarskap i klubbtidningen »Etersvep» där han är Upsredaktör, och DX-andet med sin AGA 1771, som han lyckades komma över beagnad för ett år sedan.

Något senare i DX-karriären, närmare bestämt 1994, fick BD detta QSL från Tiraspol i utbrytarregionen Transnistrien på 999 kHz. Det går fortfarande att få landet verifierat via denna anläggning.

OLLE BJURSTRÖM har en kul och intressant vägg. Han har hundratalet verifikationer från 58 länder.



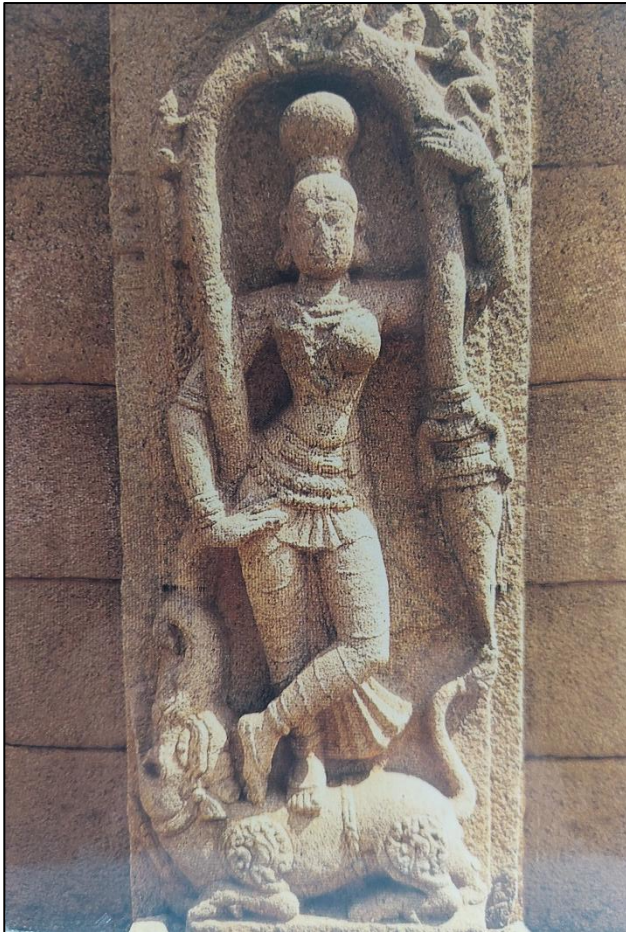
